The survey

This survey was conducted by Greenberg Quinlan Rosner in conjunction with Public Opinion Strategies for the Los Angeles Times.

These findings are based on a citywide telephone survey of 1500 registered voters (210 African American respondents, 207 unweighted; 390 Latino respondents, 502 unweighted; 210 respondents reached on cell phone, 234 unweighted) conducted June 10-16, 2009. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 2.5 percent.

- May 2005 data from *Los Angeles Times* city poll of 3,236 Los Angeles adults conducted May 2-8, 2005. Data presented from the 2,176 registered voters within the sample.
- February 2005 data from *Los Angeles Times* city poll of 2,525 Los Angeles adults conducted February 21-27, 2005. Data presented from the 1,636 registered voters within the sample.
- Early February 2005 data from *Los Angeles Times* city poll of 2,045 Los Angeles adults conducted January 26 through February 3, 2005. Data presented from the 1,454 registered voters within the sample.

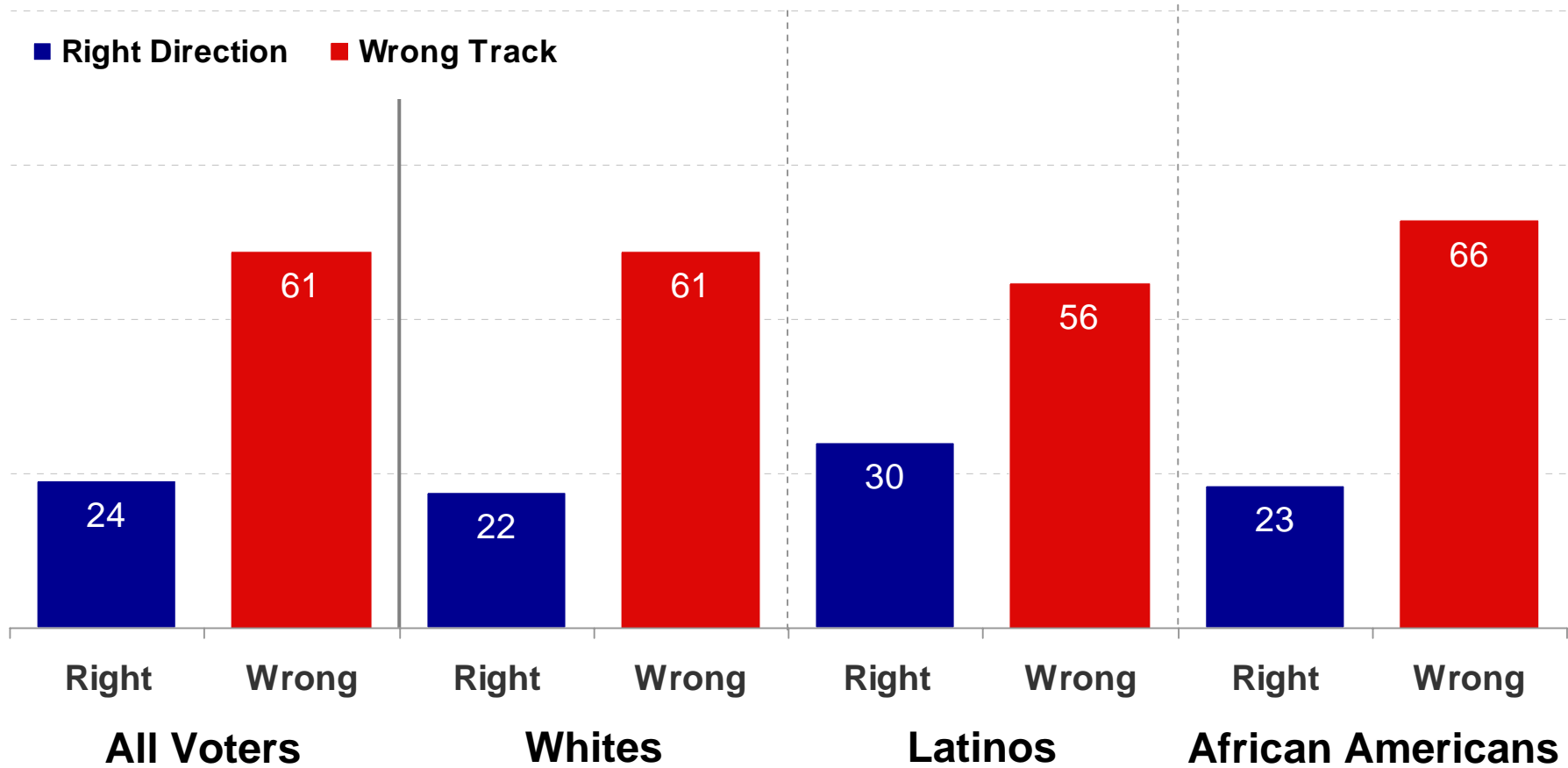


Status of the City and State

And now, generally speaking, do you think that things in the city of Los Angeles are going in the right direction, or do you feel things have gotten pretty seriously off on the wrong track?

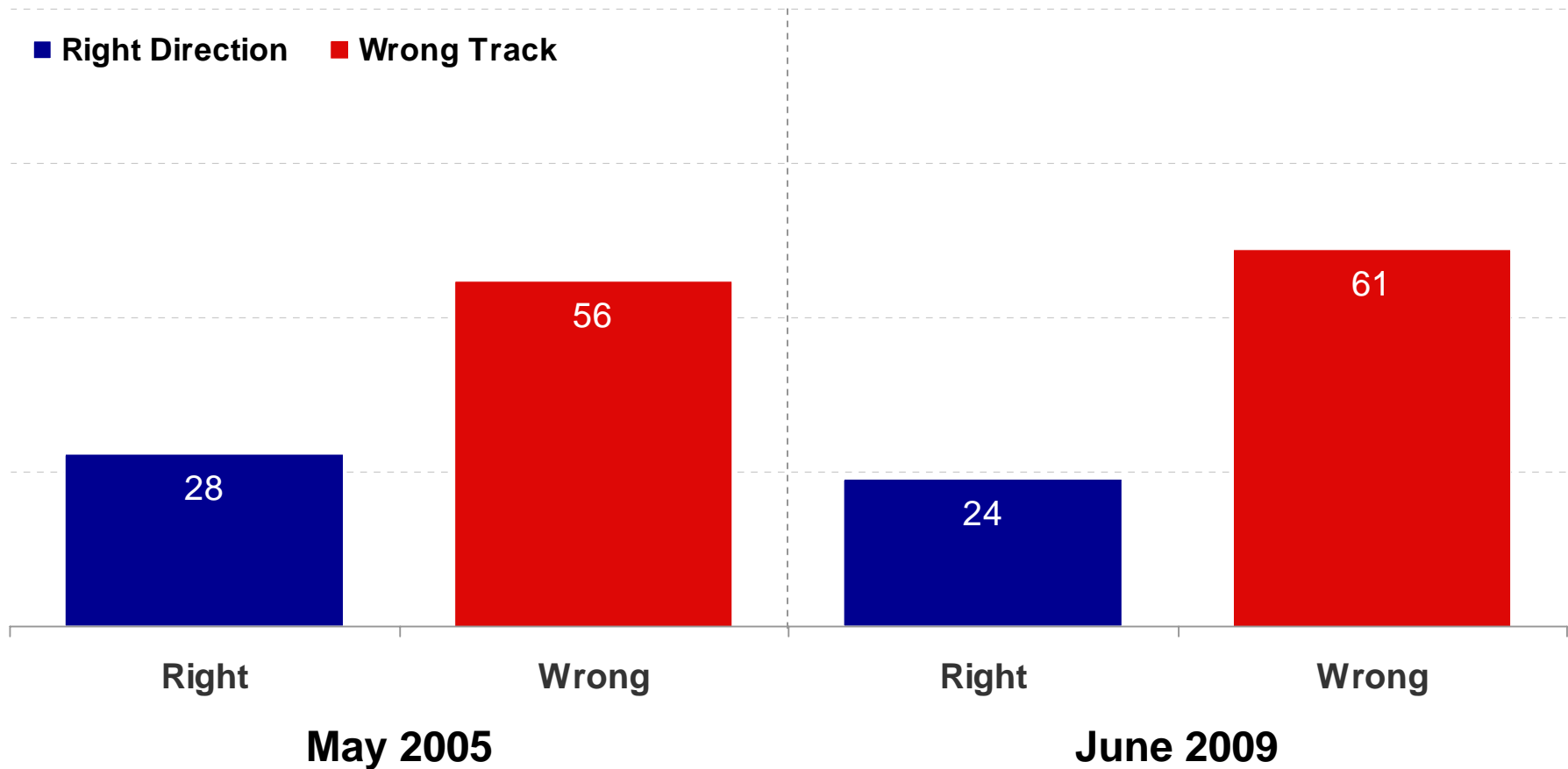




Pessimism higher 4 years later

And now, generally speaking, do you think that things in the city of Los Angeles are going in the right direction, or do you feel things have gotten pretty seriously off on the wrong track?

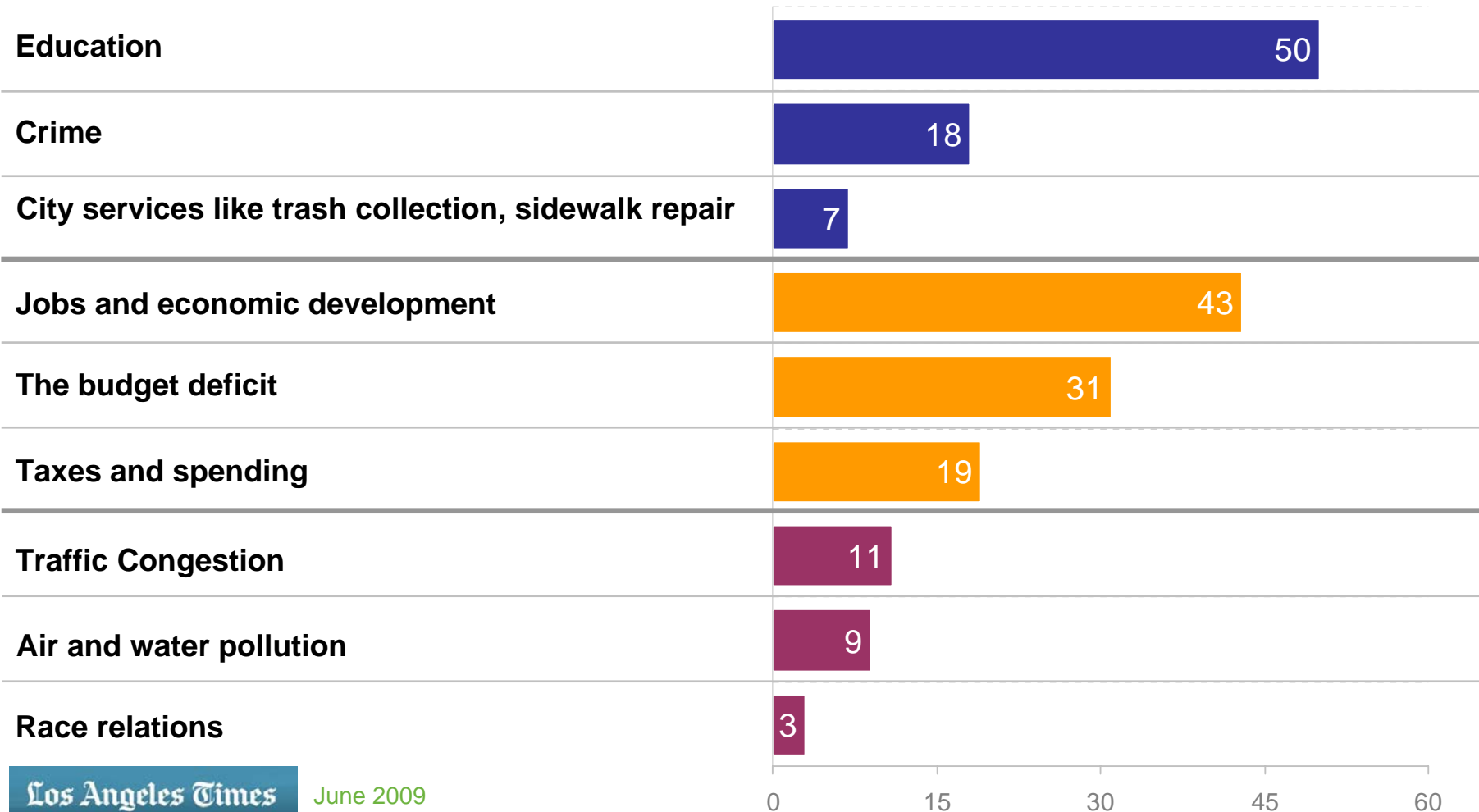

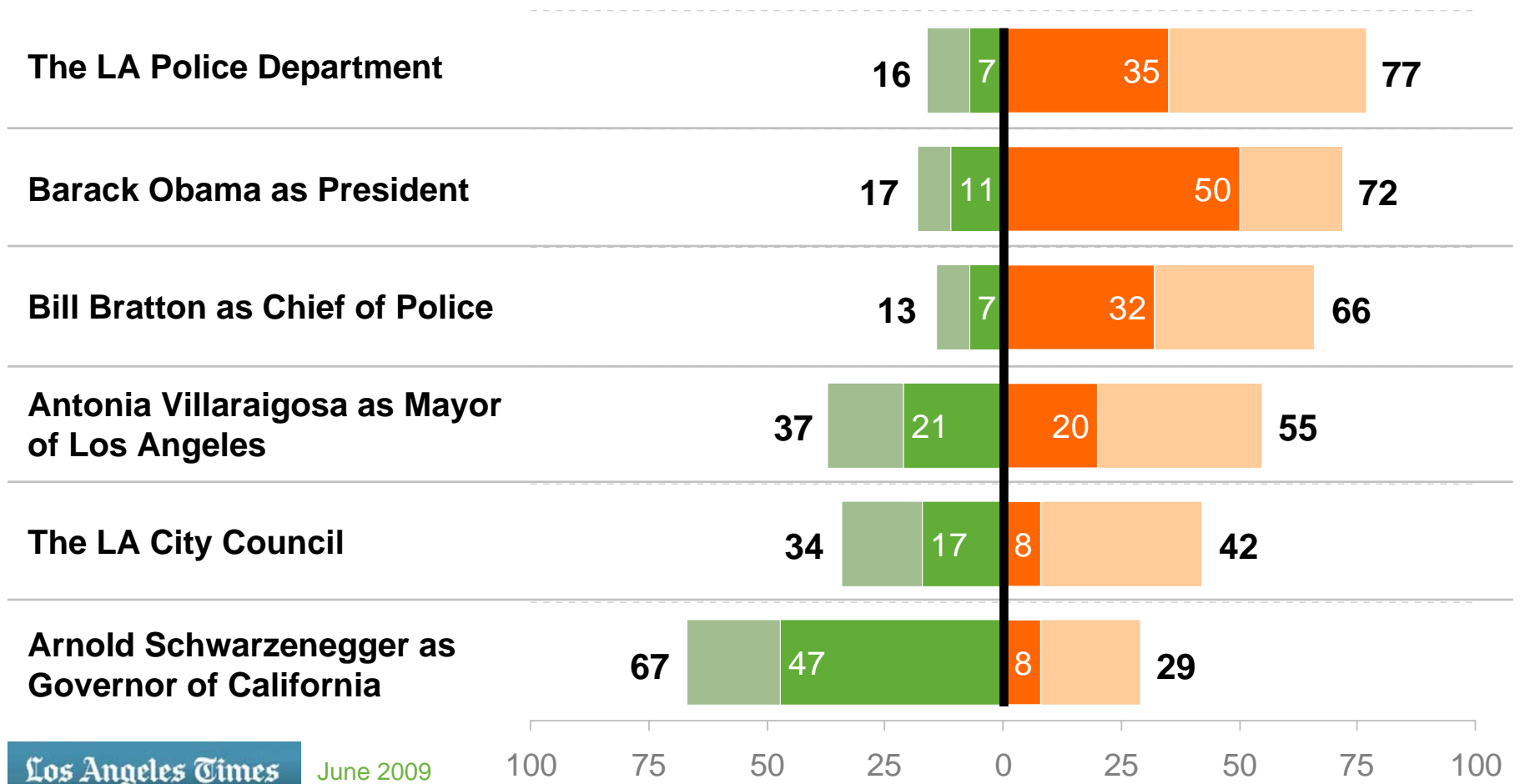

Do you approve or disapprove of the job being done by...

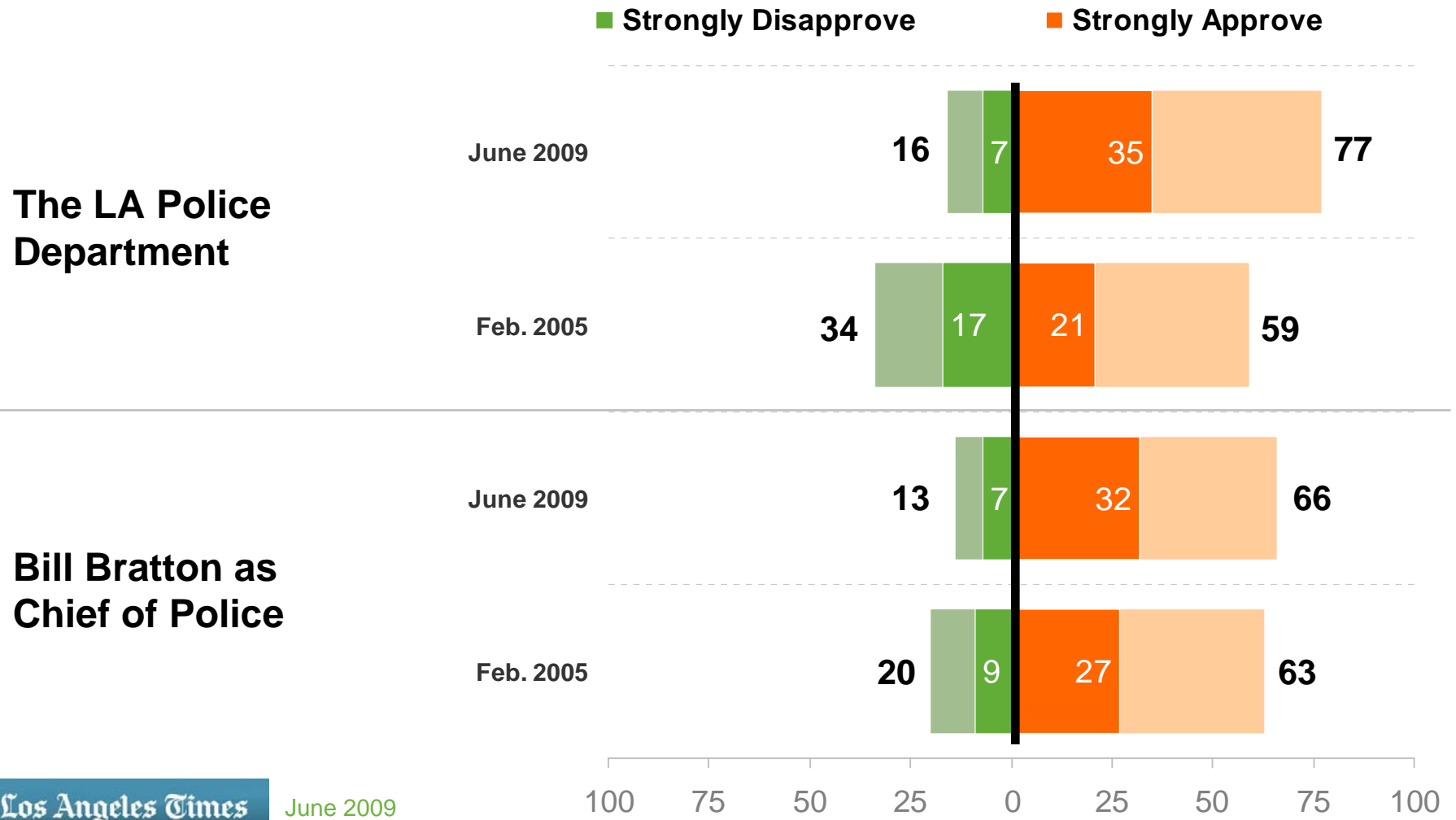

LAPD, Bratton approval on rise since 2005

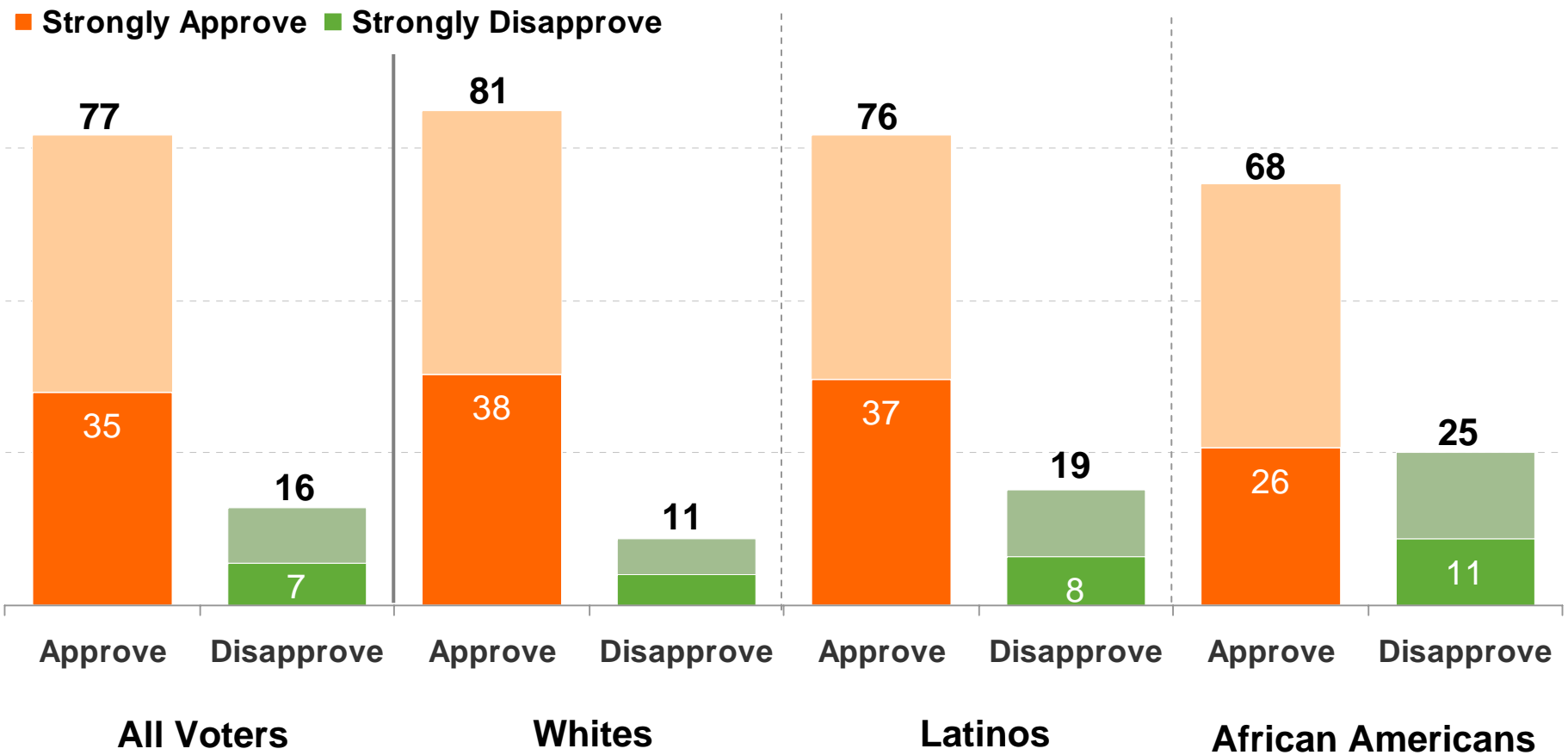
Do you approve or disapprove of the job being done by...

Do you approve or disapprove of the job being done by... the Los Angeles Police Department?

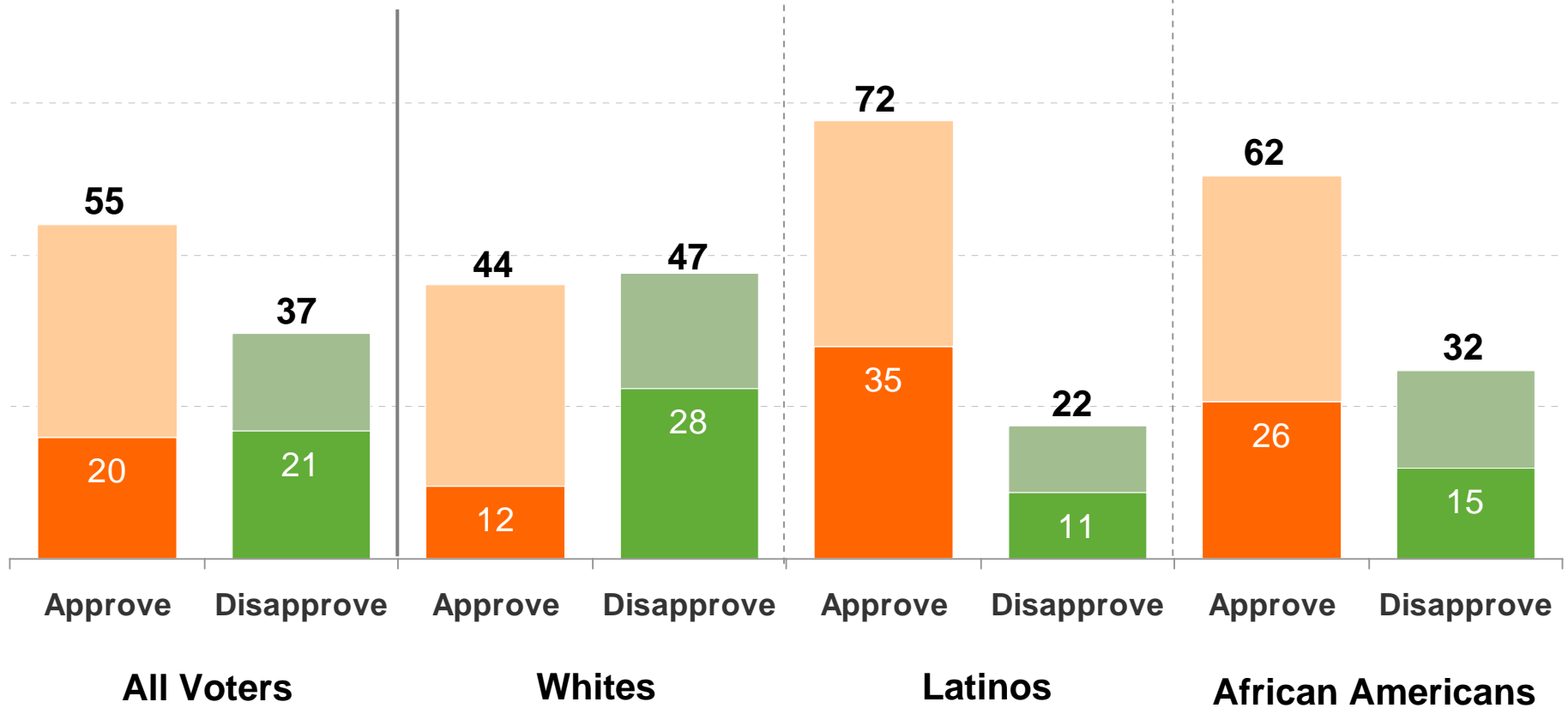




Villaraigosa's approval strongest among Latinos

 ■ Strongly Disapprove

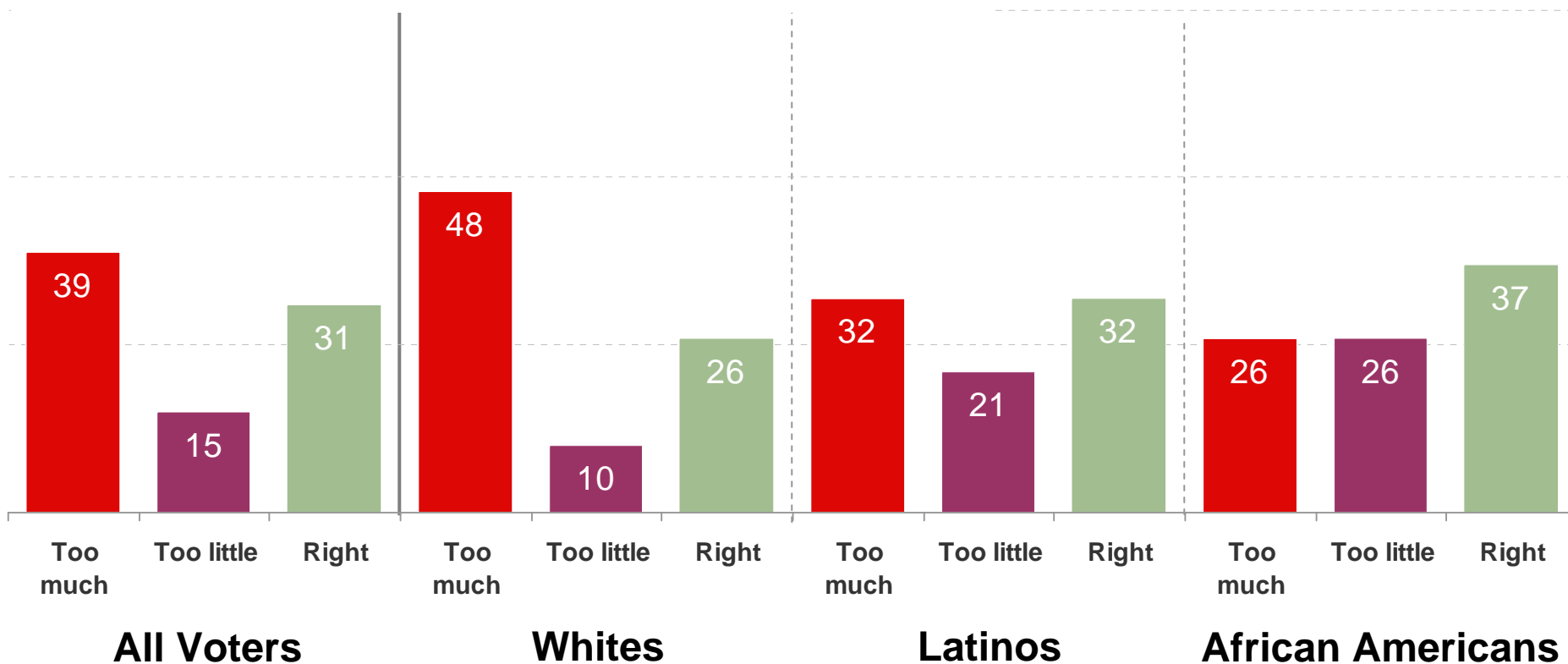




City employee unions have too much influence

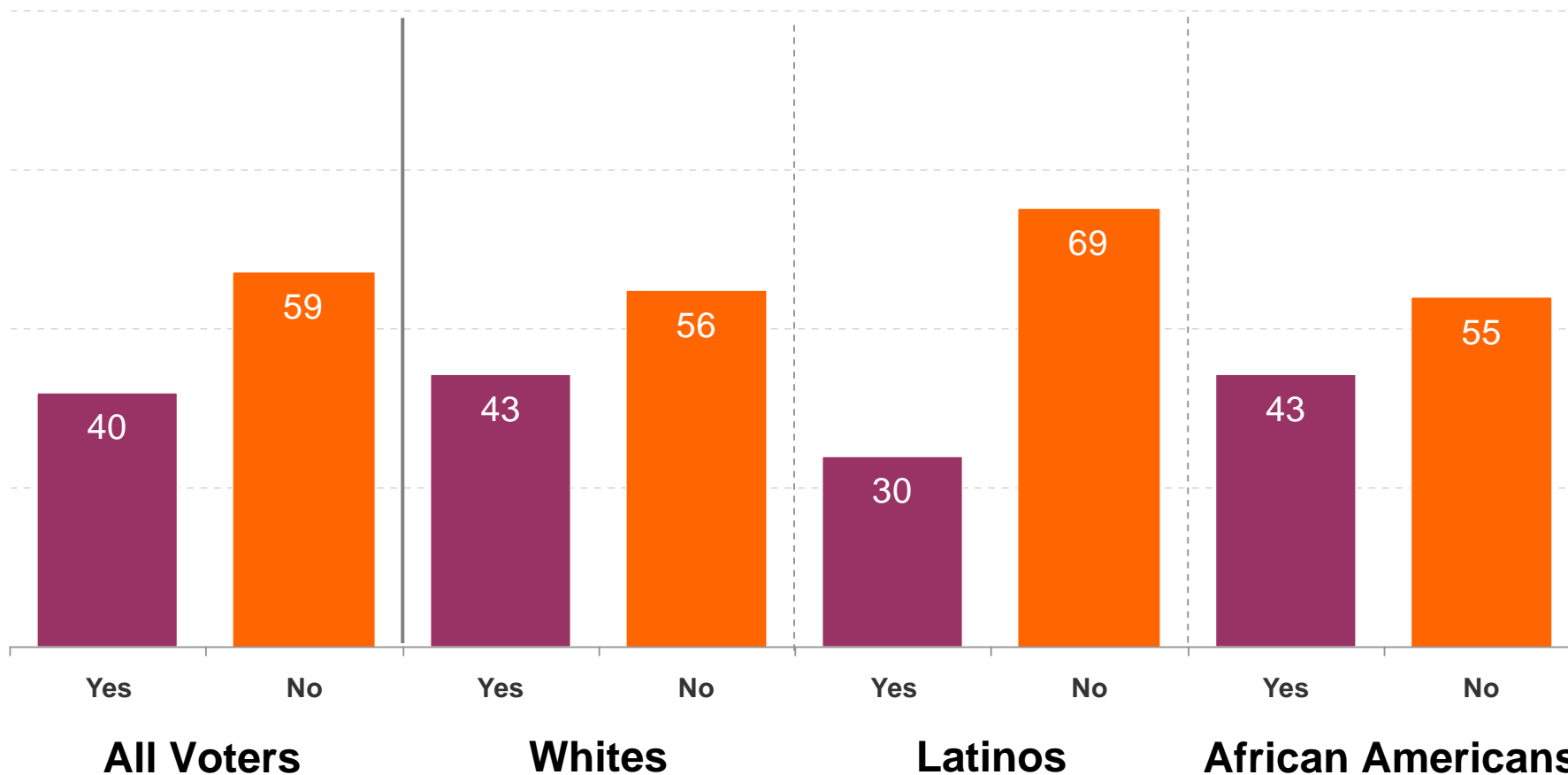

40 percent of voters have seriously considered leaving L.A.

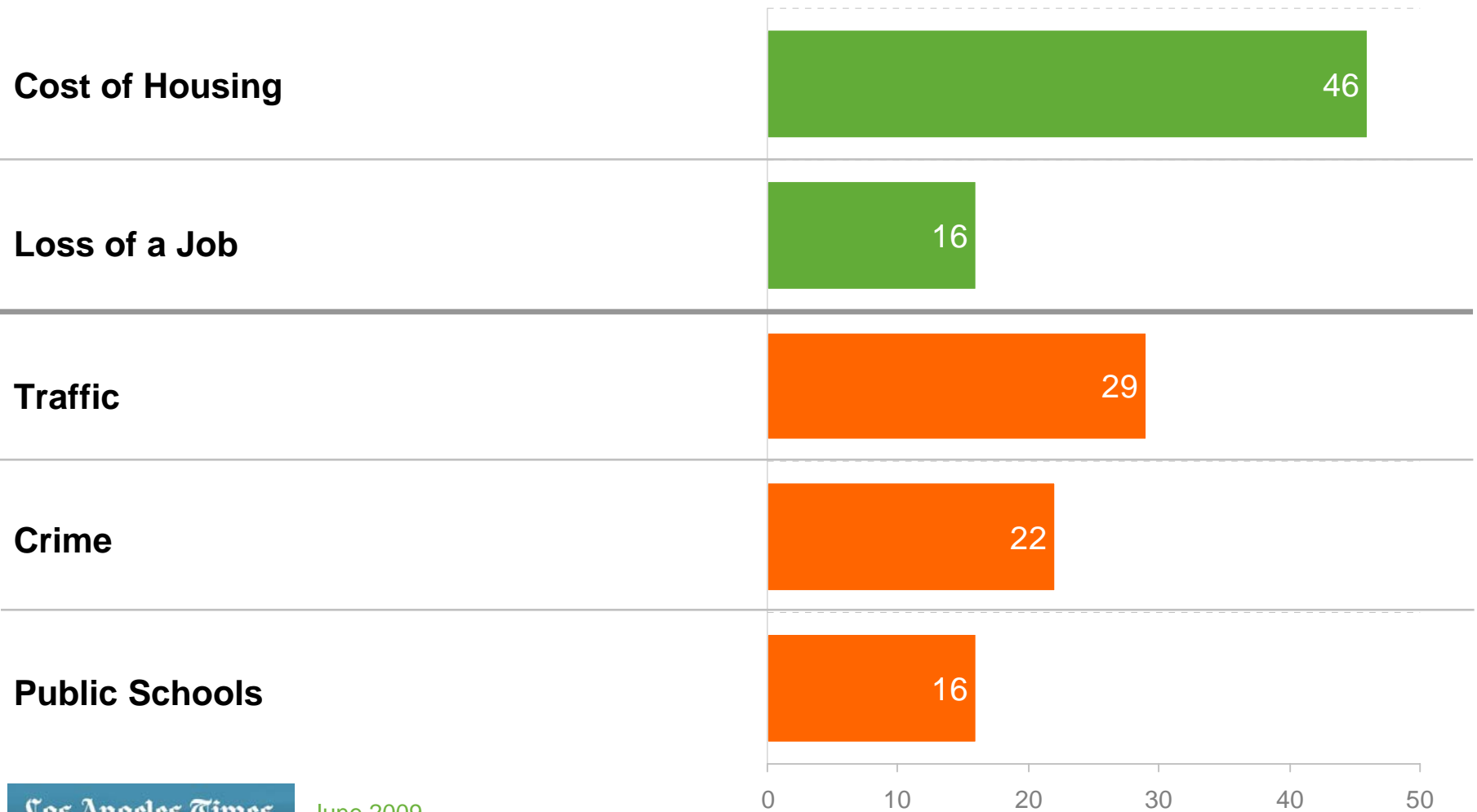
In the last couple of years have you seriously thought about moving out of Los Angeles to another town or city?





Cost of housing key component to thoughts of leaving

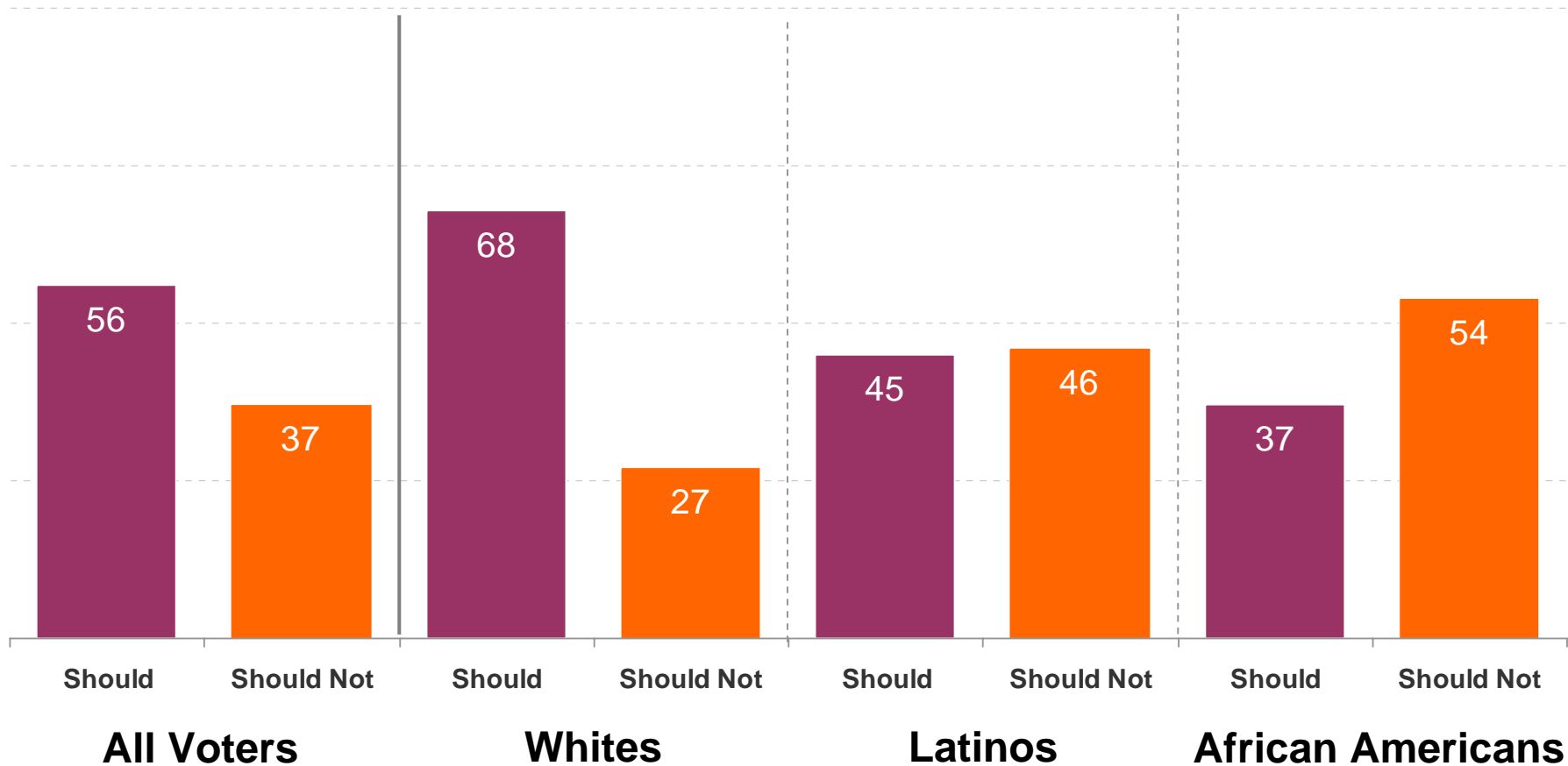
Please tell me which TWO, if any, of the following caused you to most think about leaving Los Angeles





African Americans against same-sex marriage, Latinos divided

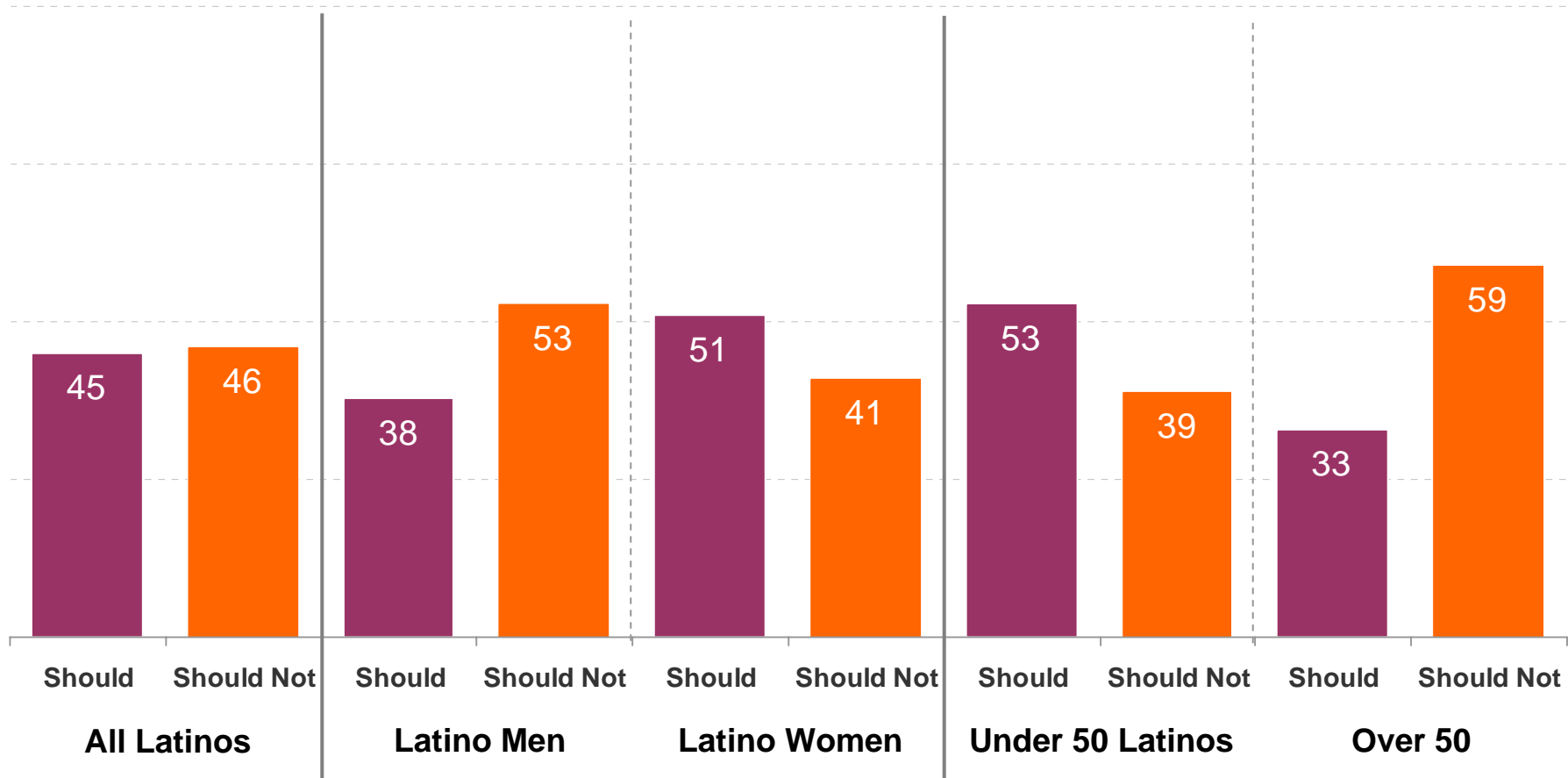
Do you think marriages between same-sex couples should or should not be recognized by the law as valid?

Do you think marriages between same-sex couples should or should not be recognized by the law as valid?



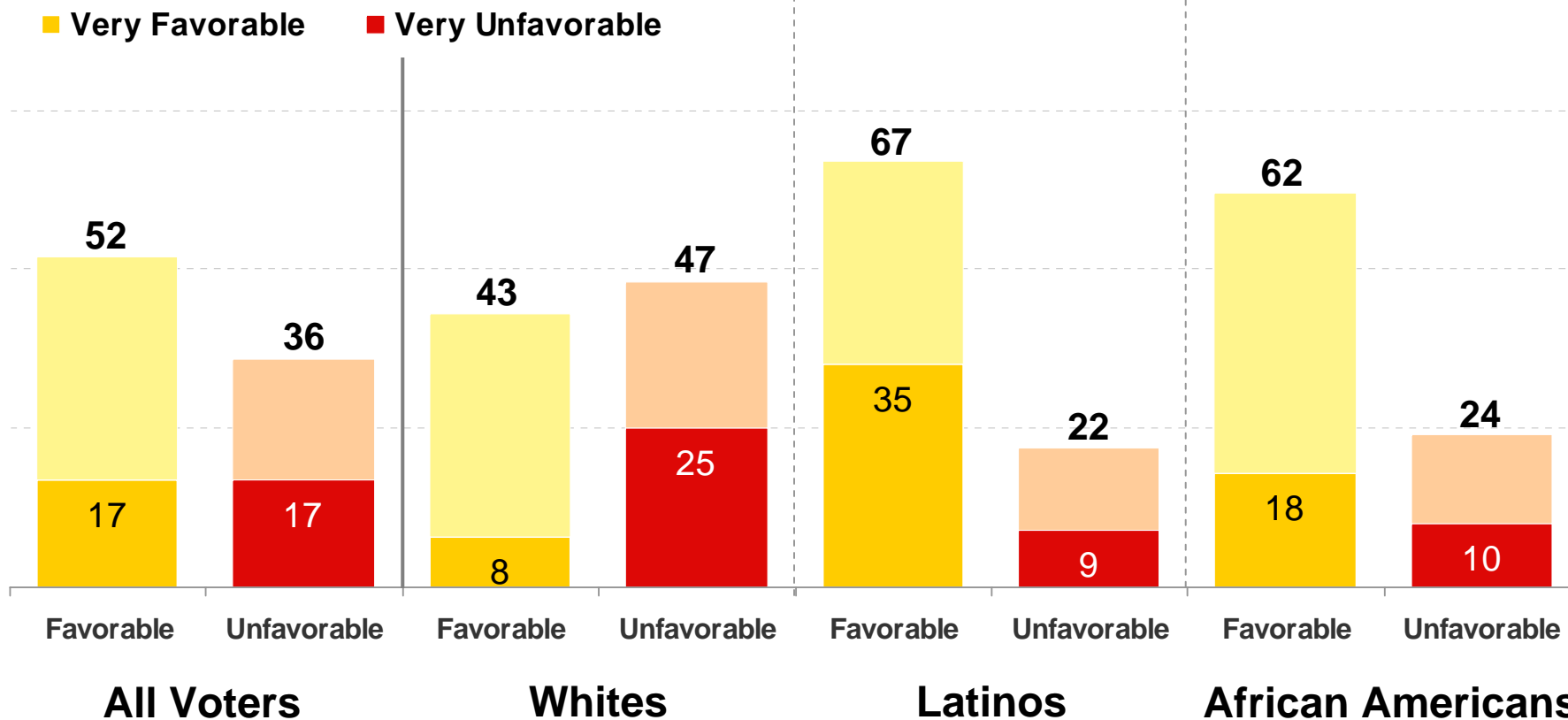


Position of the Mayor



Villaraigosa viewed favorably, very favorably among Latinos

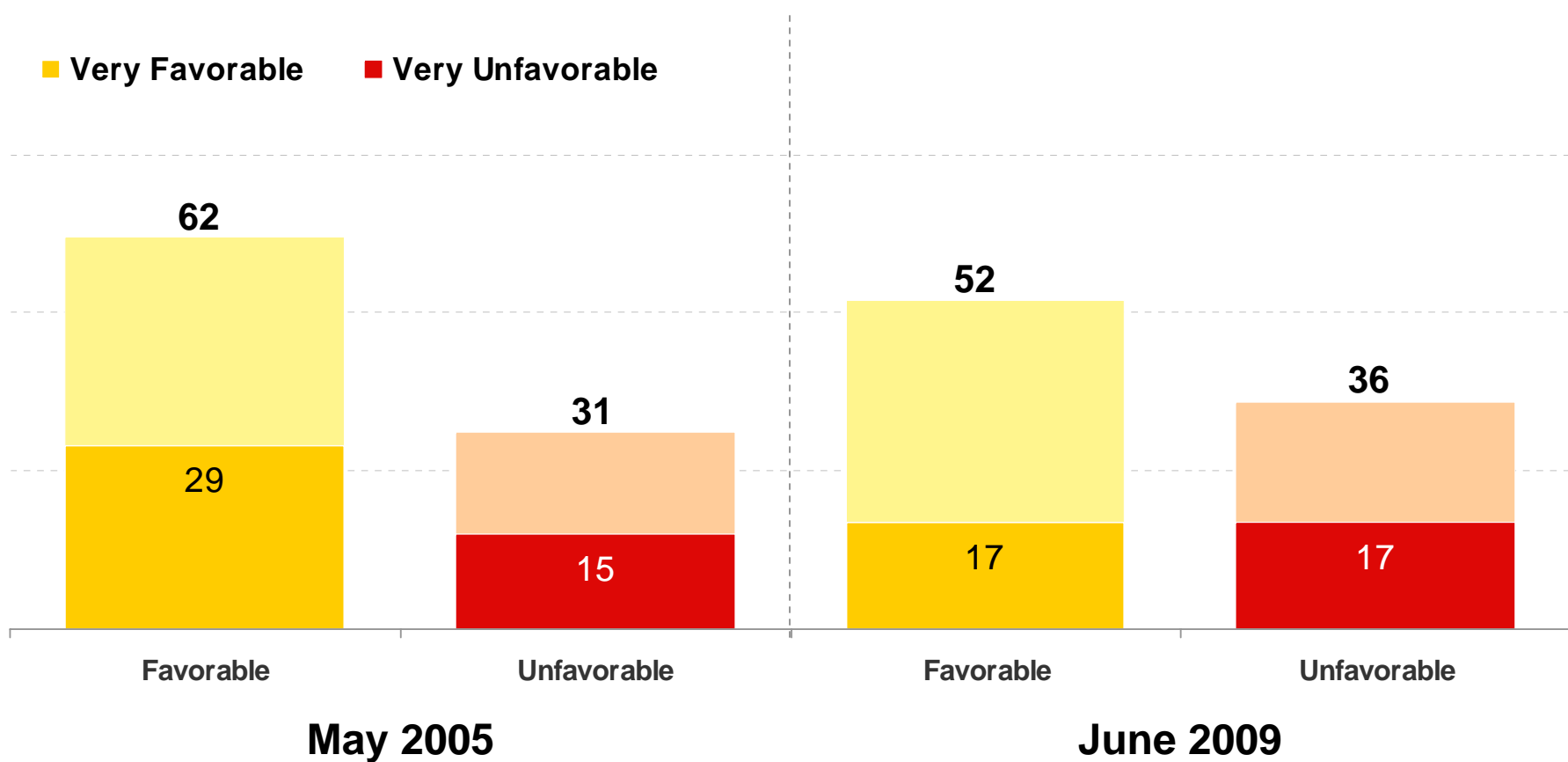

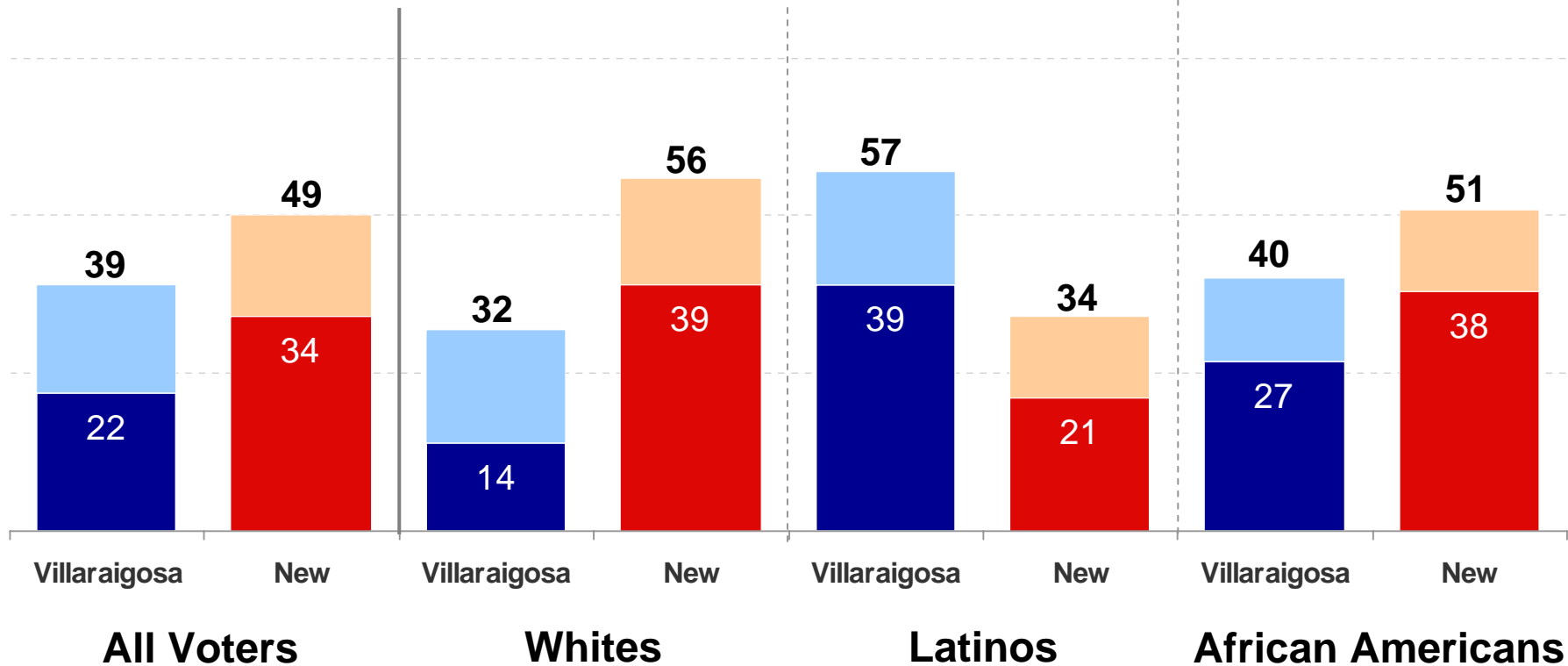




Should go in new direction from the mayor's

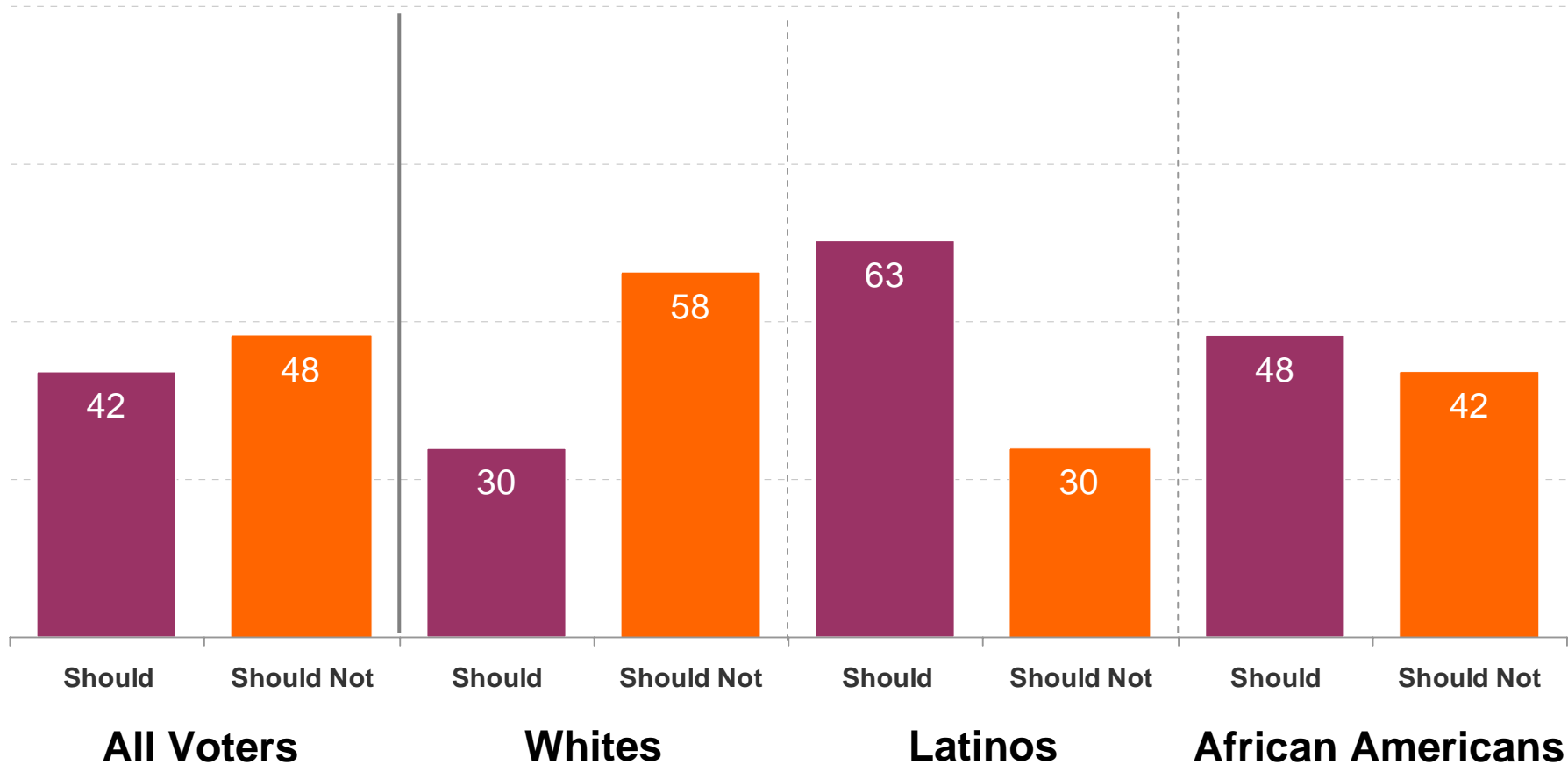
■ Villaraigosa Direction Strongly ■ New Direction Strongly

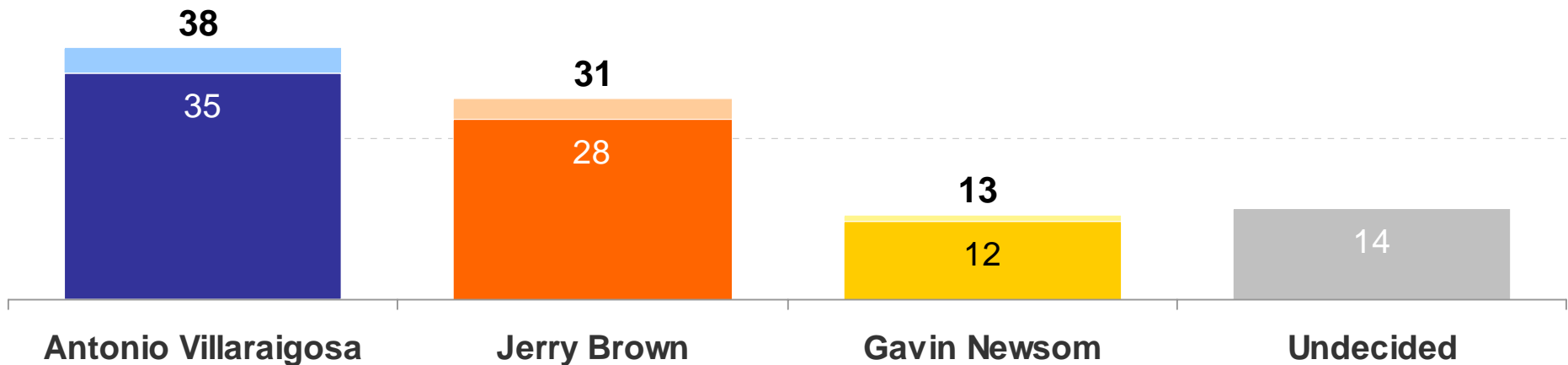




Eligible Democratic primary voters narrowly favor Villaraigosa for nomination

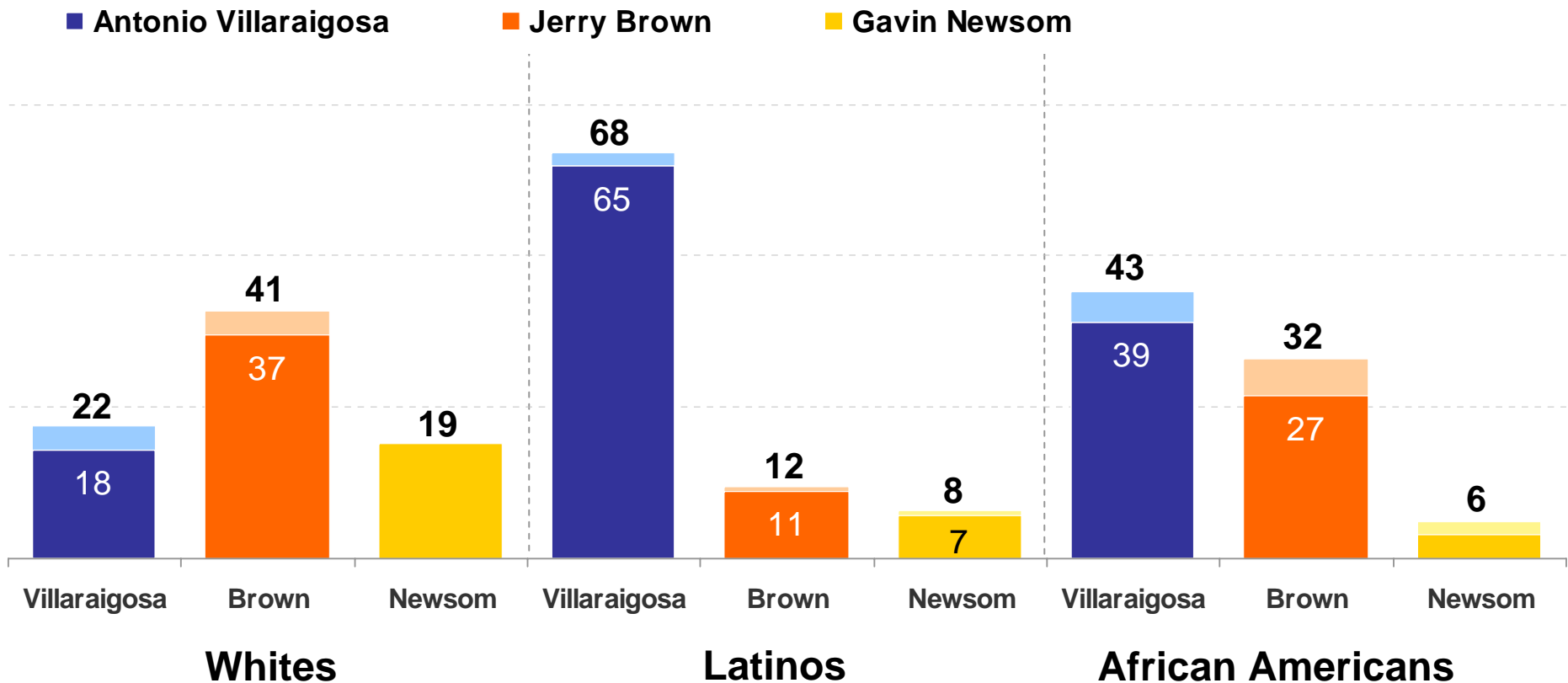

Latino Democratic primary voters strongly for Villaraigosa

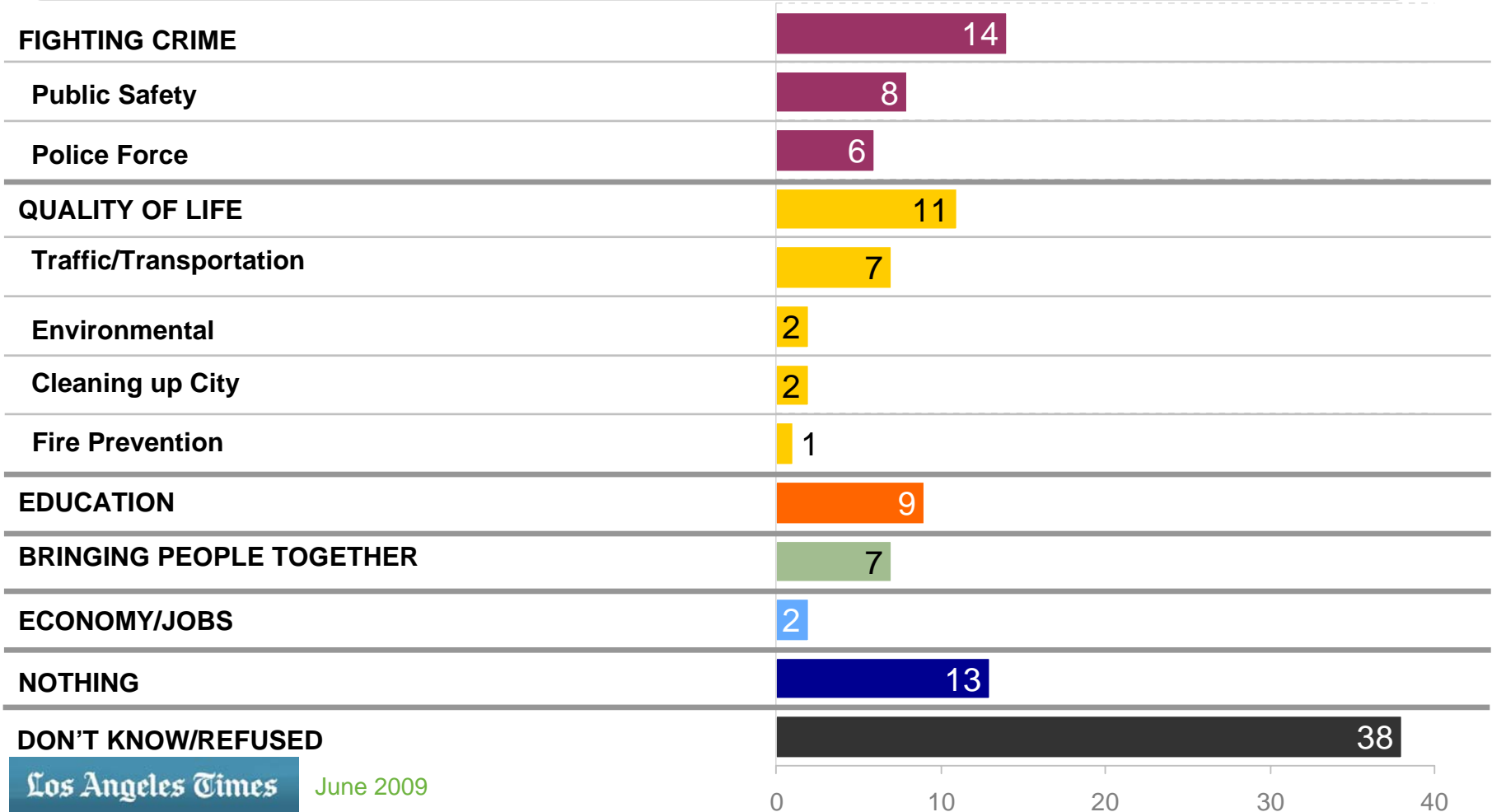

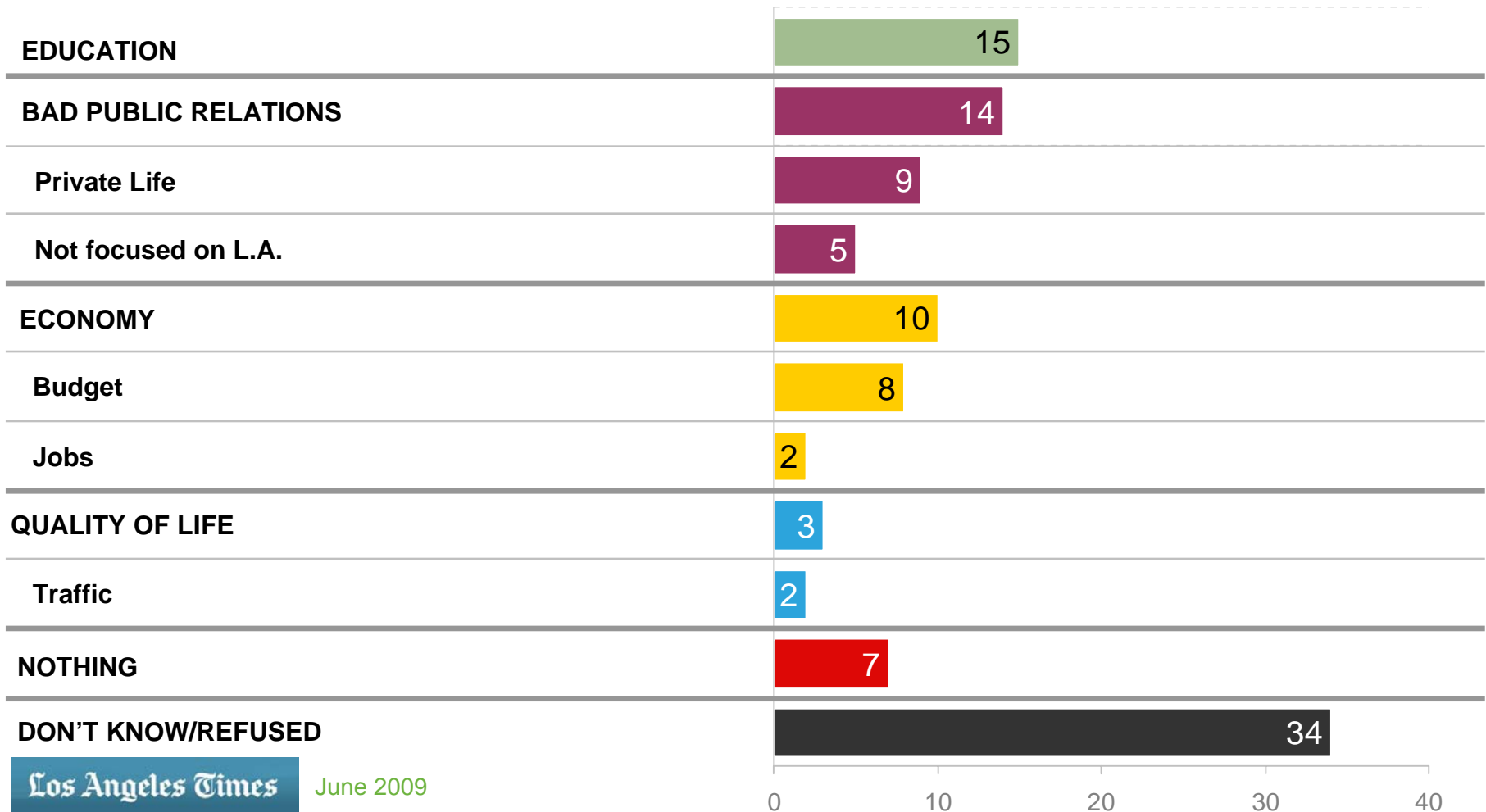

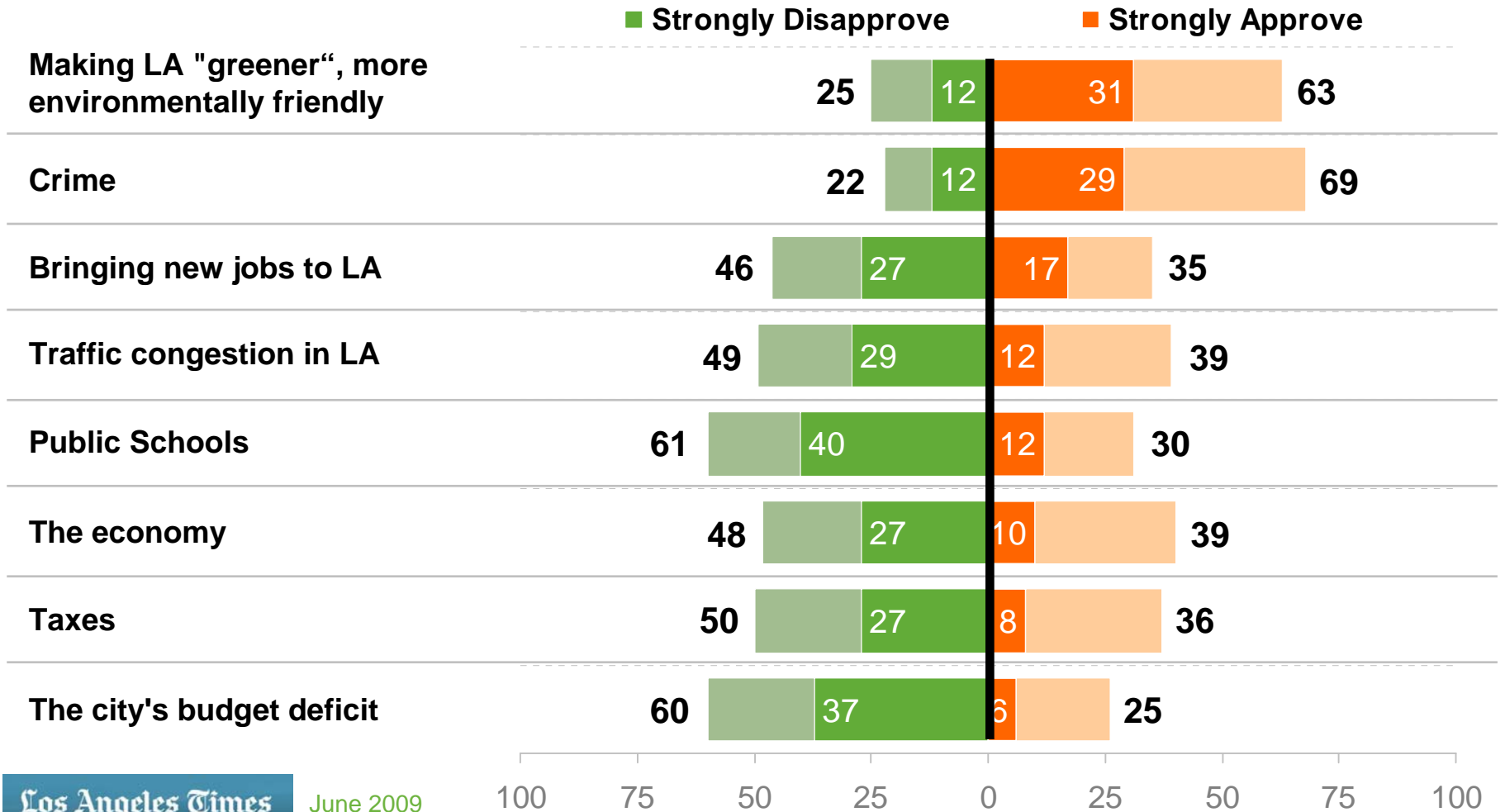

Now I'm going to read you a list of issues. For each one, I would like you to tell me if you approve or disapprove of the job being done by Mayor Villaraigosa on that issue.

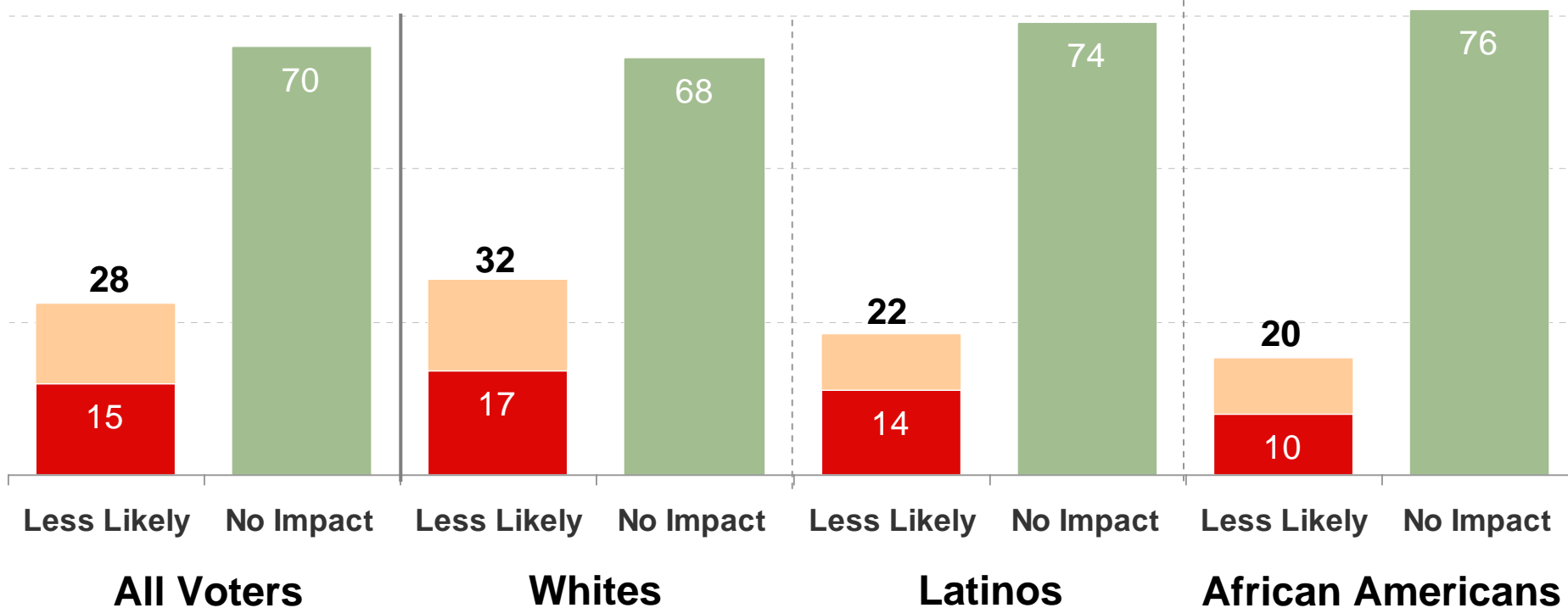




Affair has little impact on Villaraigosa's future votes

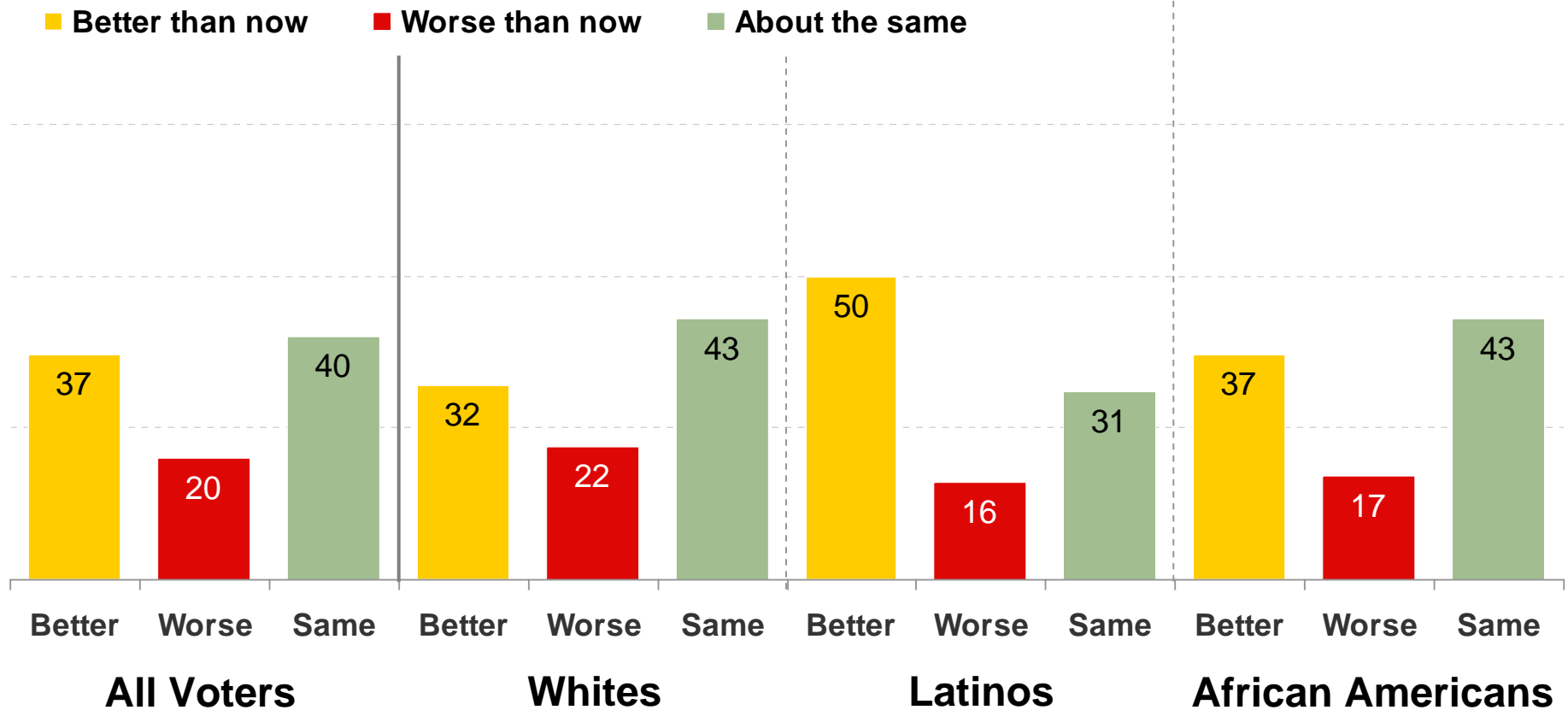

Six months from now, do you expect Los Angeles' economy will be better than now, worse than now or about the same as now?

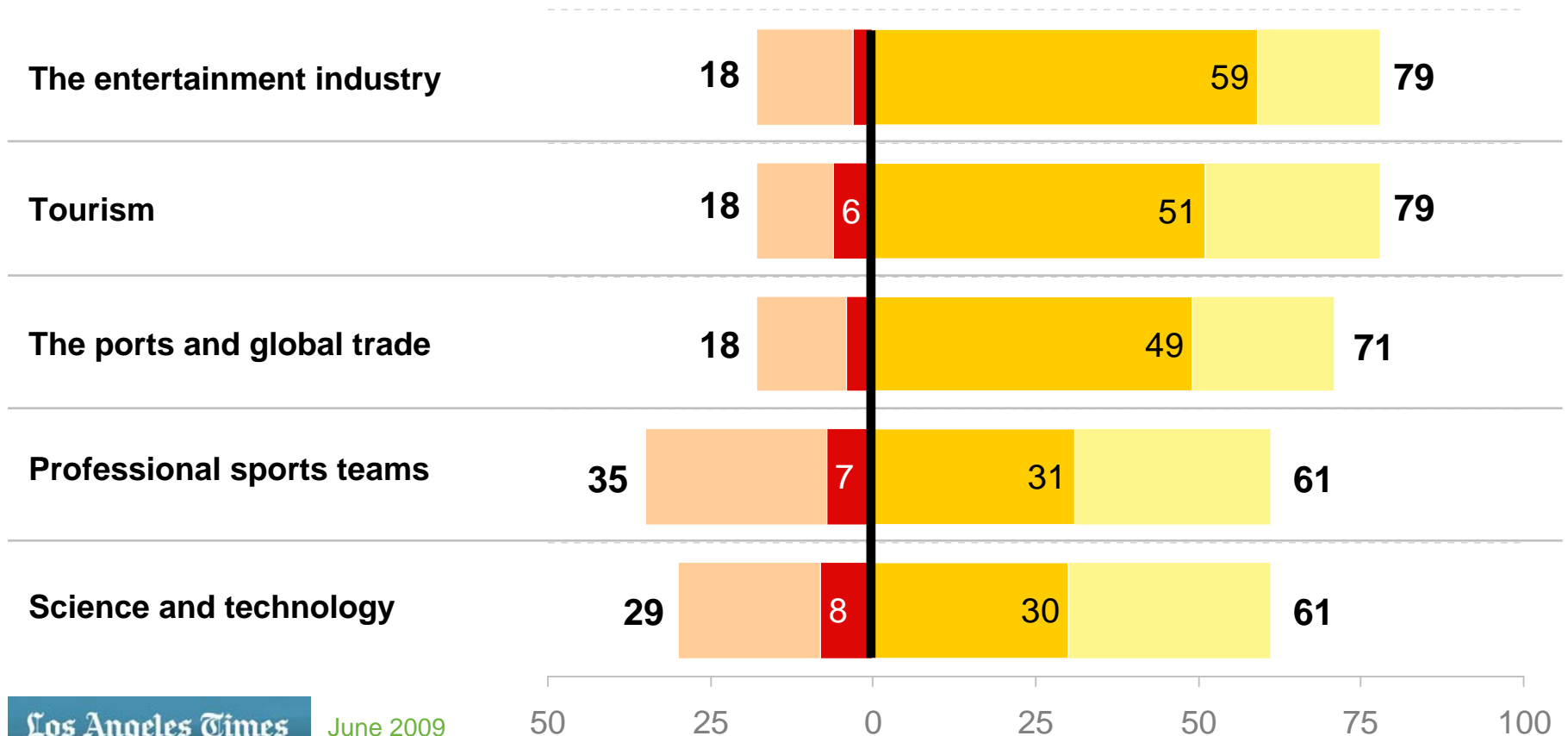




Entertainment industry contributes a great deal to LA economy

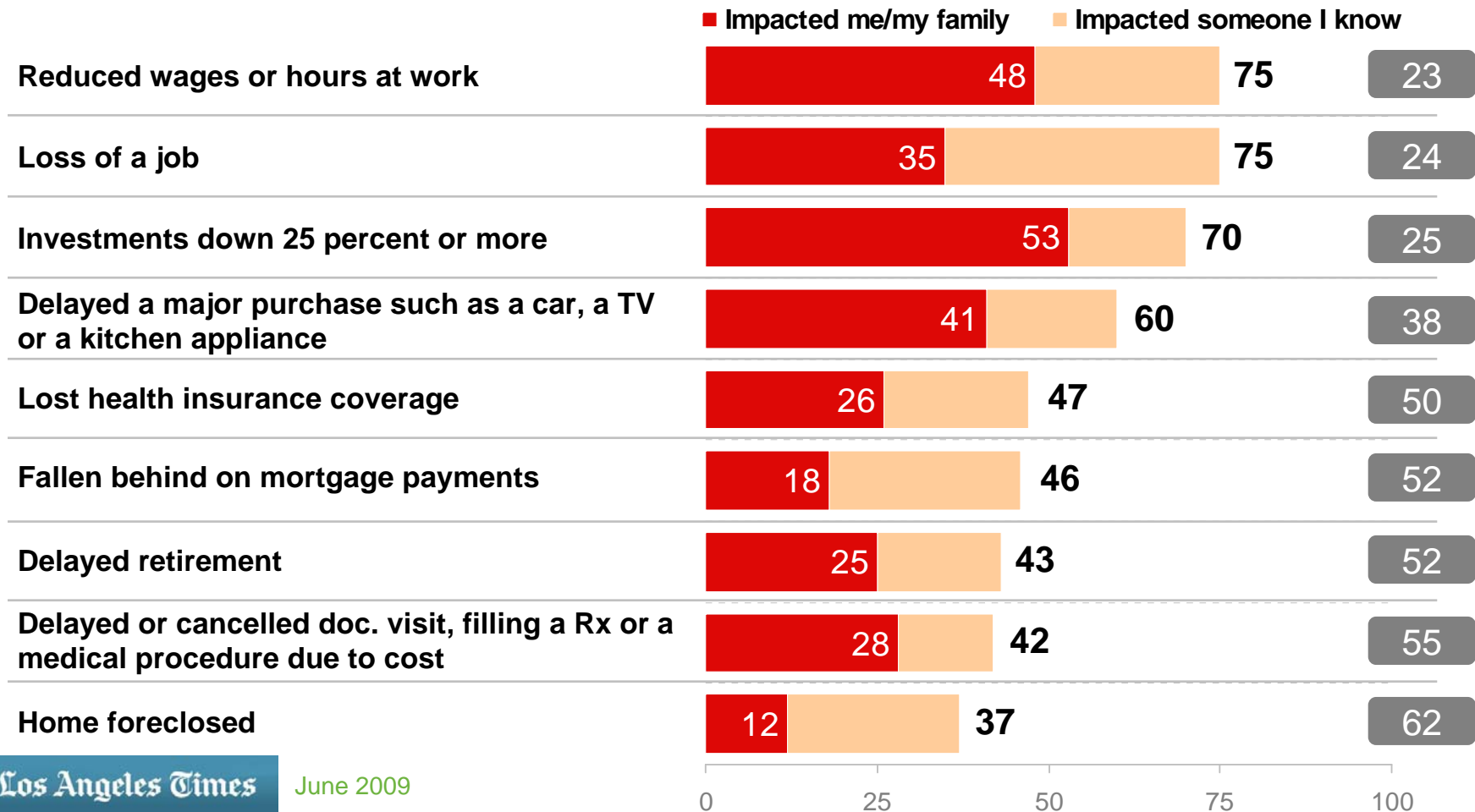




Impact of economic recession

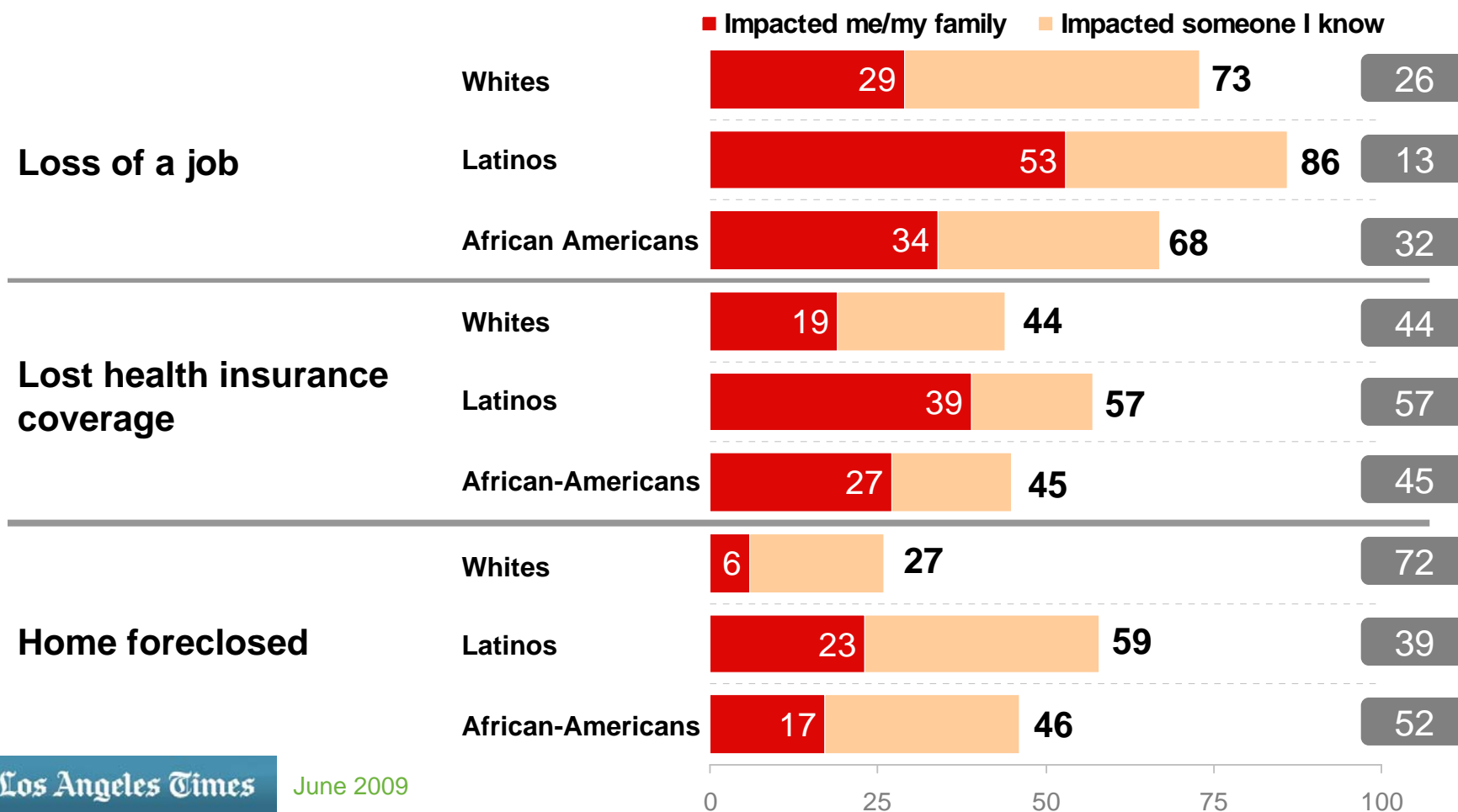




Elements of recession hit racial groups differently

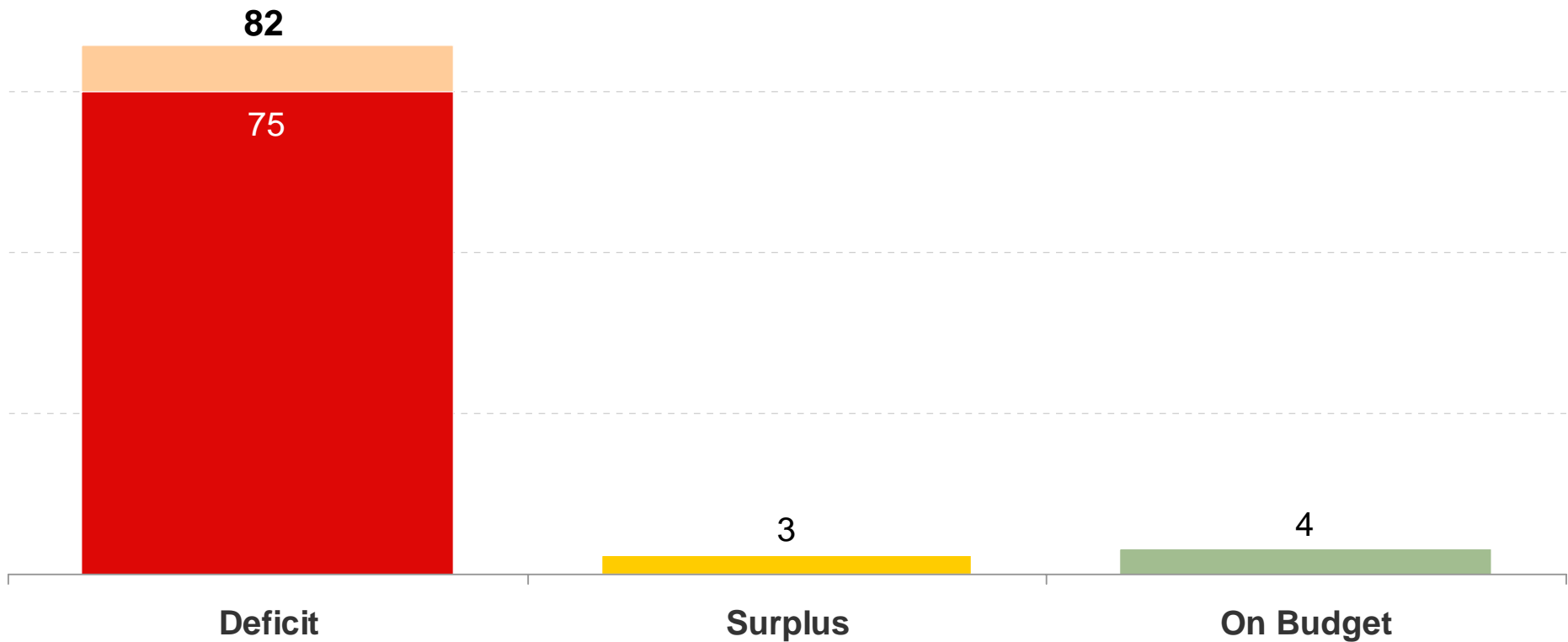

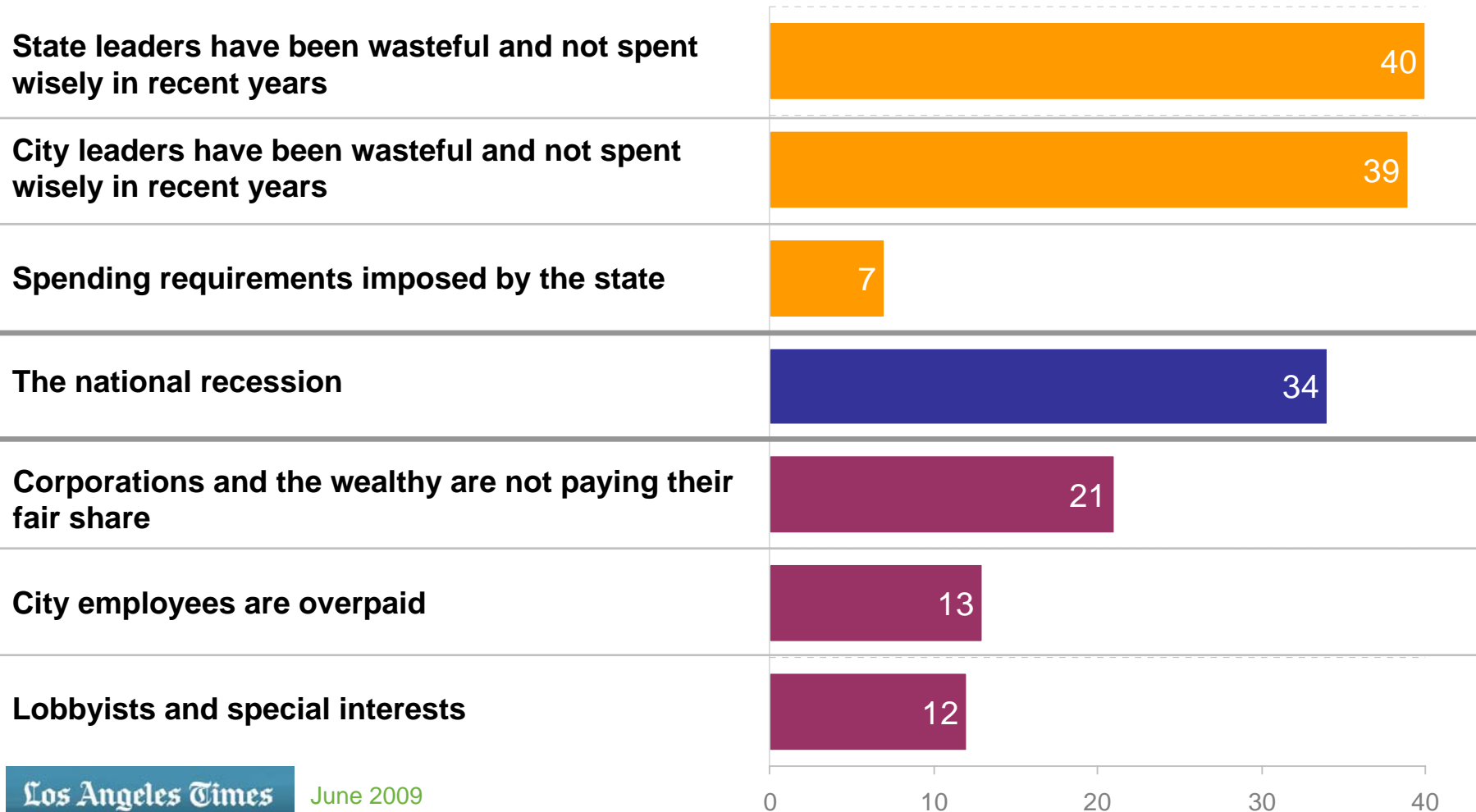

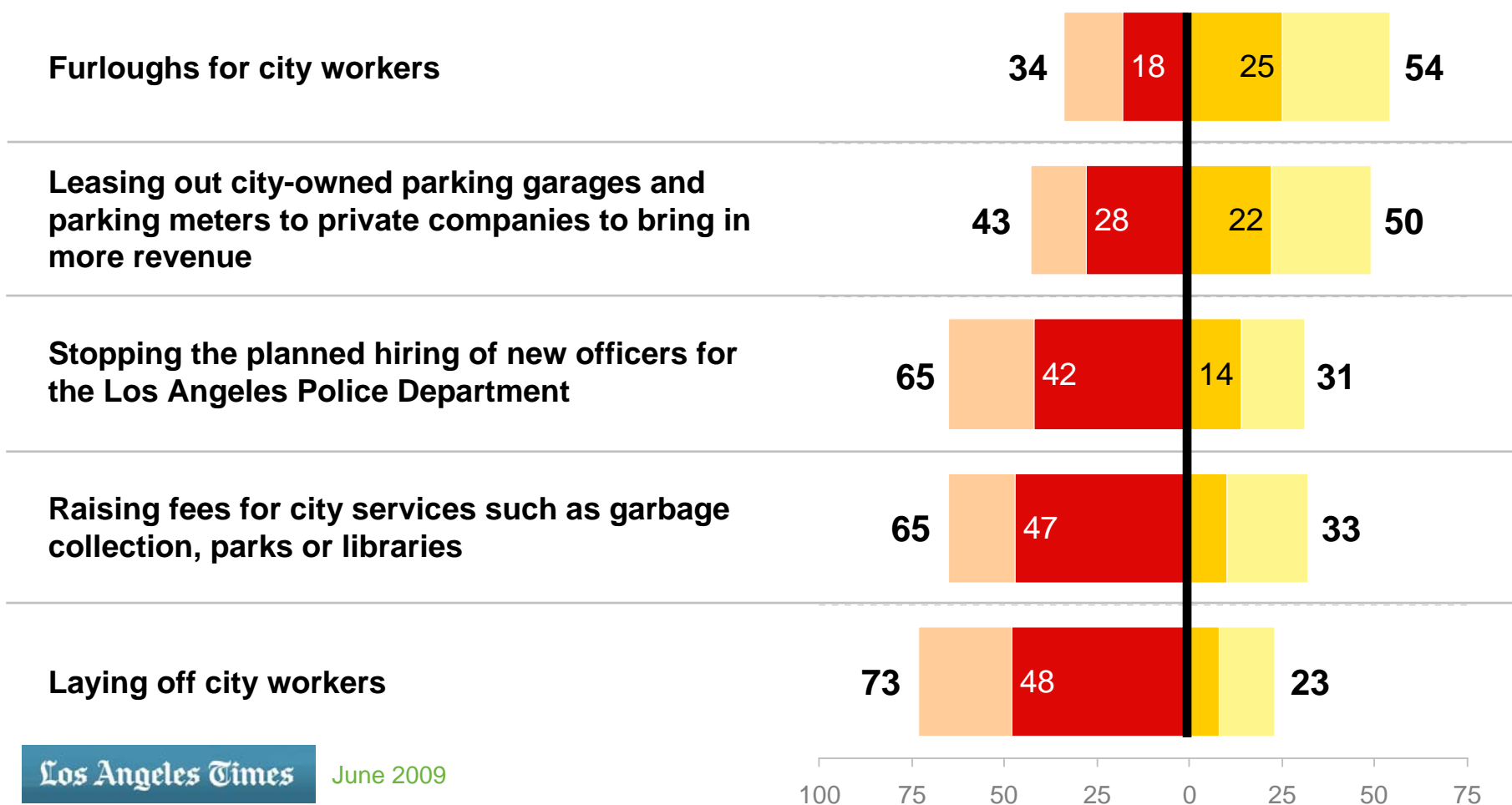




Ways to close the LA budget deficit

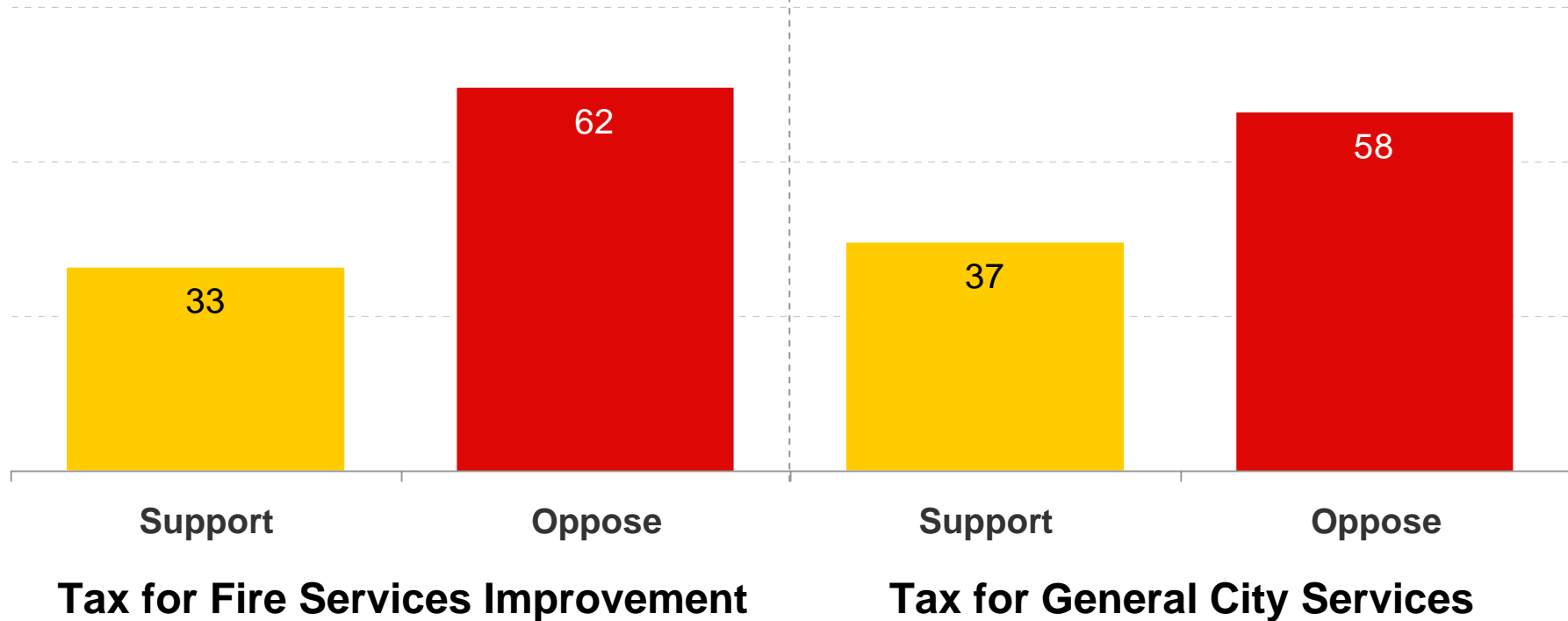


6-in-10 oppose additional taxes regardless of purpose

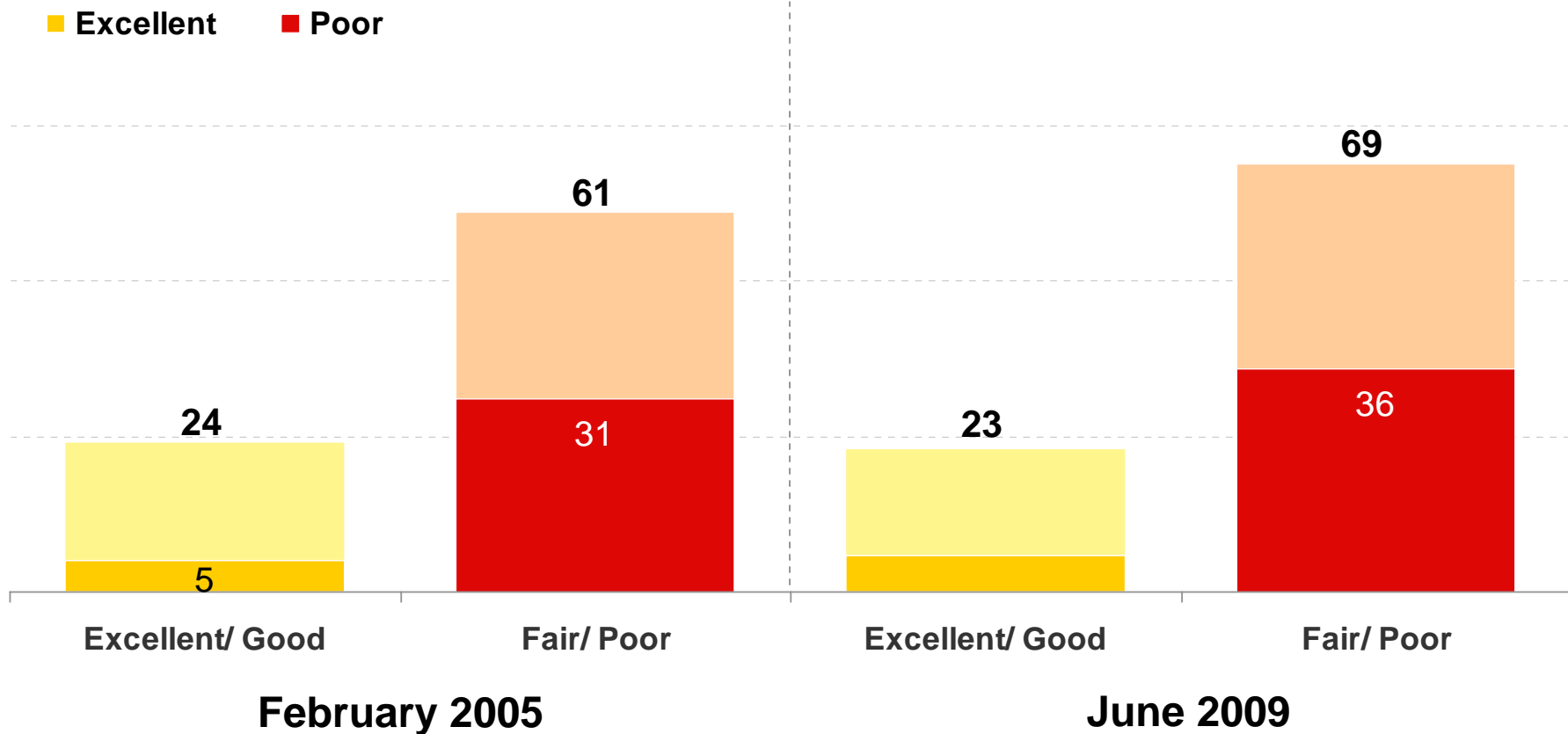


Public Education

In general, how would you rate the overall quality of education at your local public schools today: is it excellent, good, fair or poor?



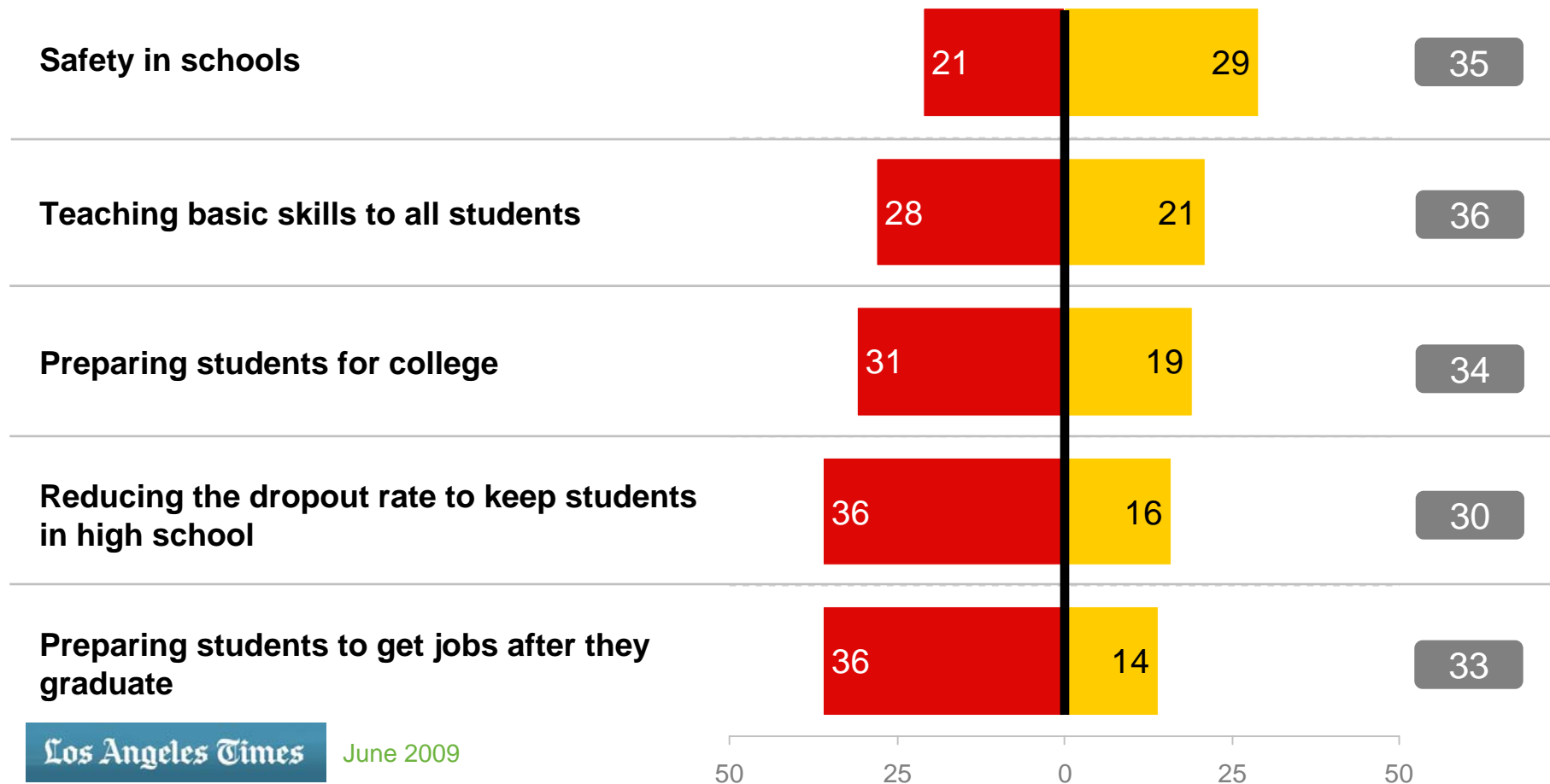


Safety improving, but 1/3 see schools at status quo

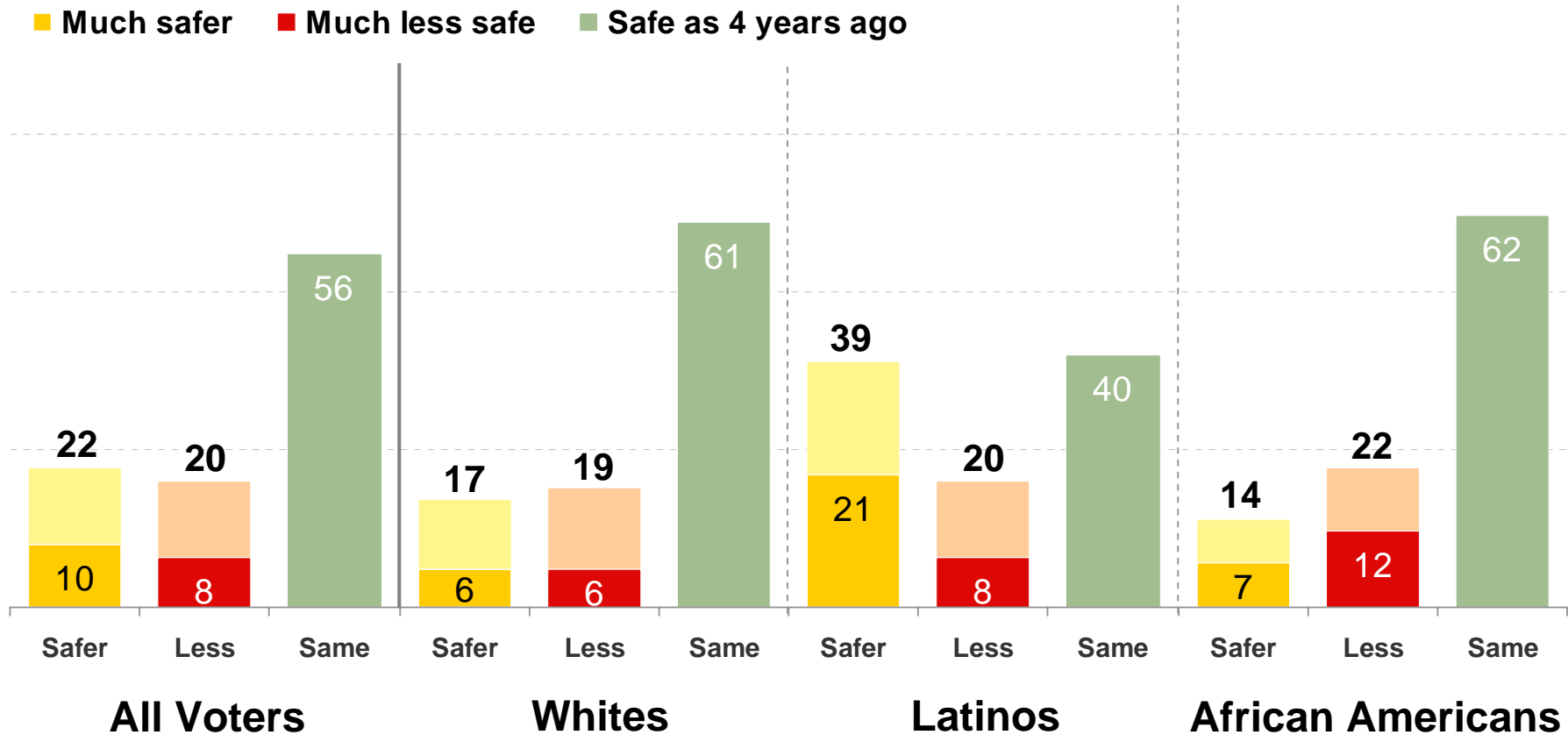

When it comes to the threat of crime, do you feel safer in your community than you did four years ago, do you feel less safe, or do you feel just about as safe in your community as you did four years ago?



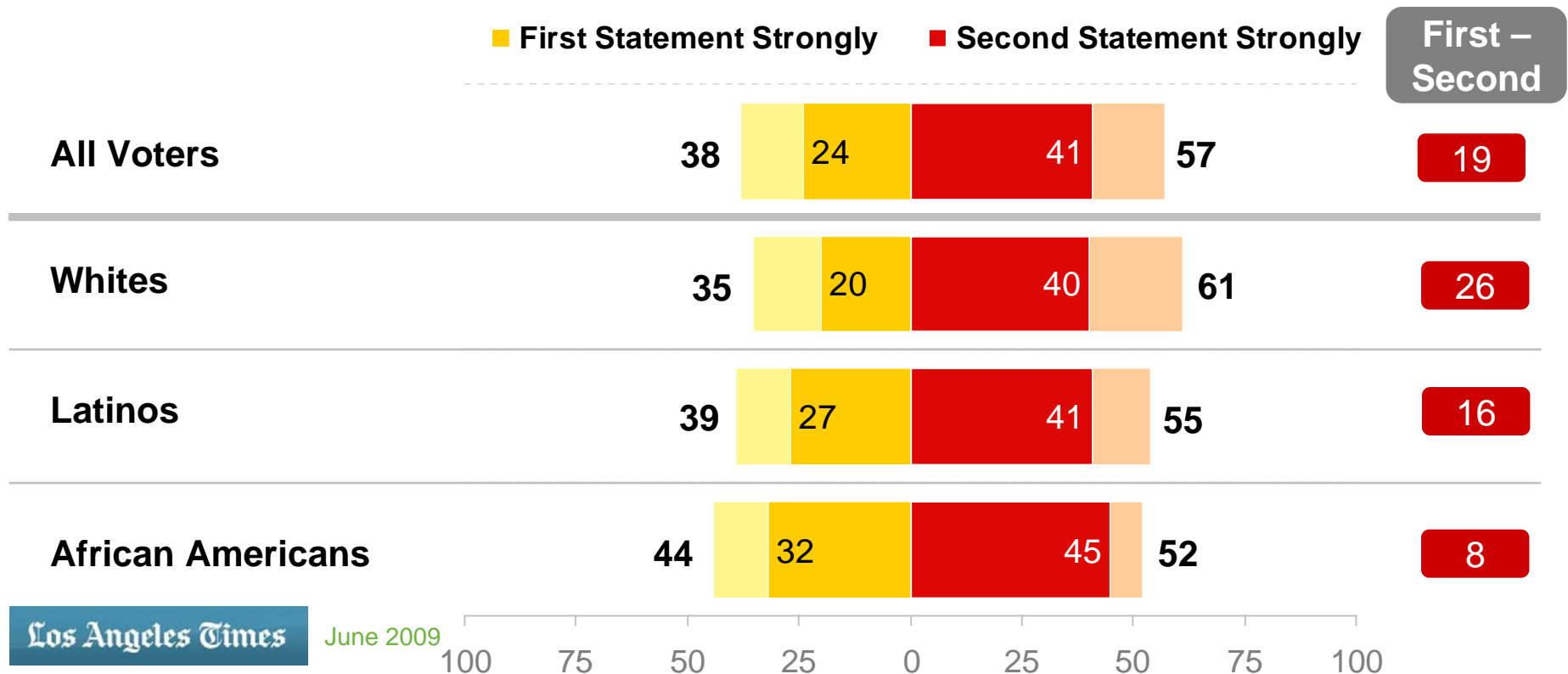


Strong support behind continuing to increase the police force

First Statement: Some people say that with crime down and the city facing a 529 million dollar budget deficit, continuing to hire another thousand police officers over the next few years does not make sense right now.

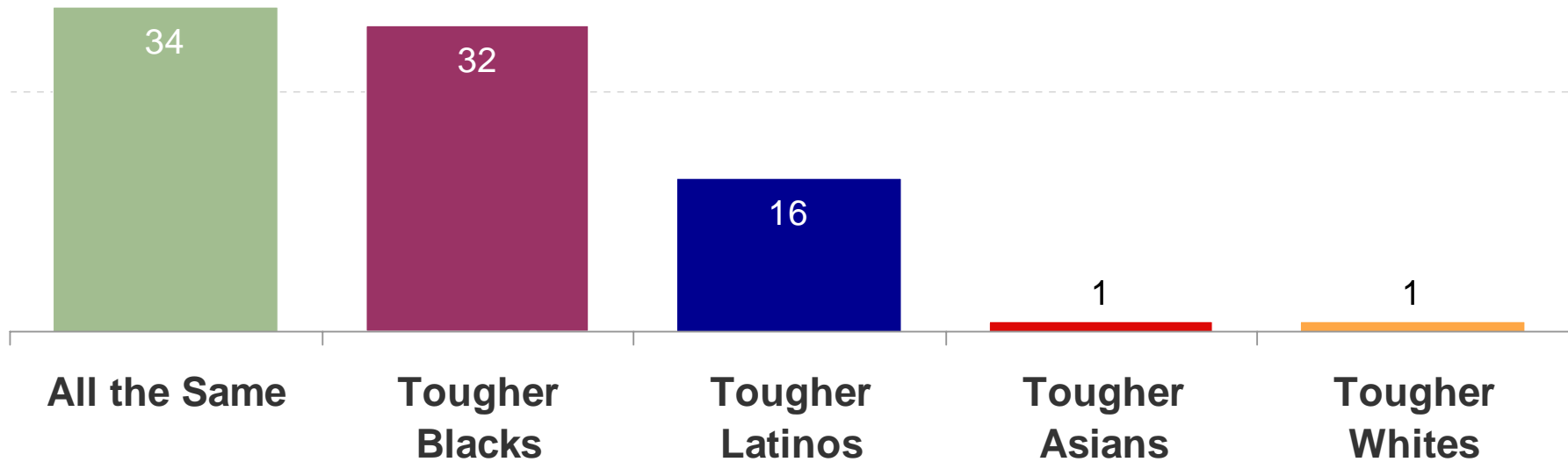

A third say LAPD is tougher on blacks

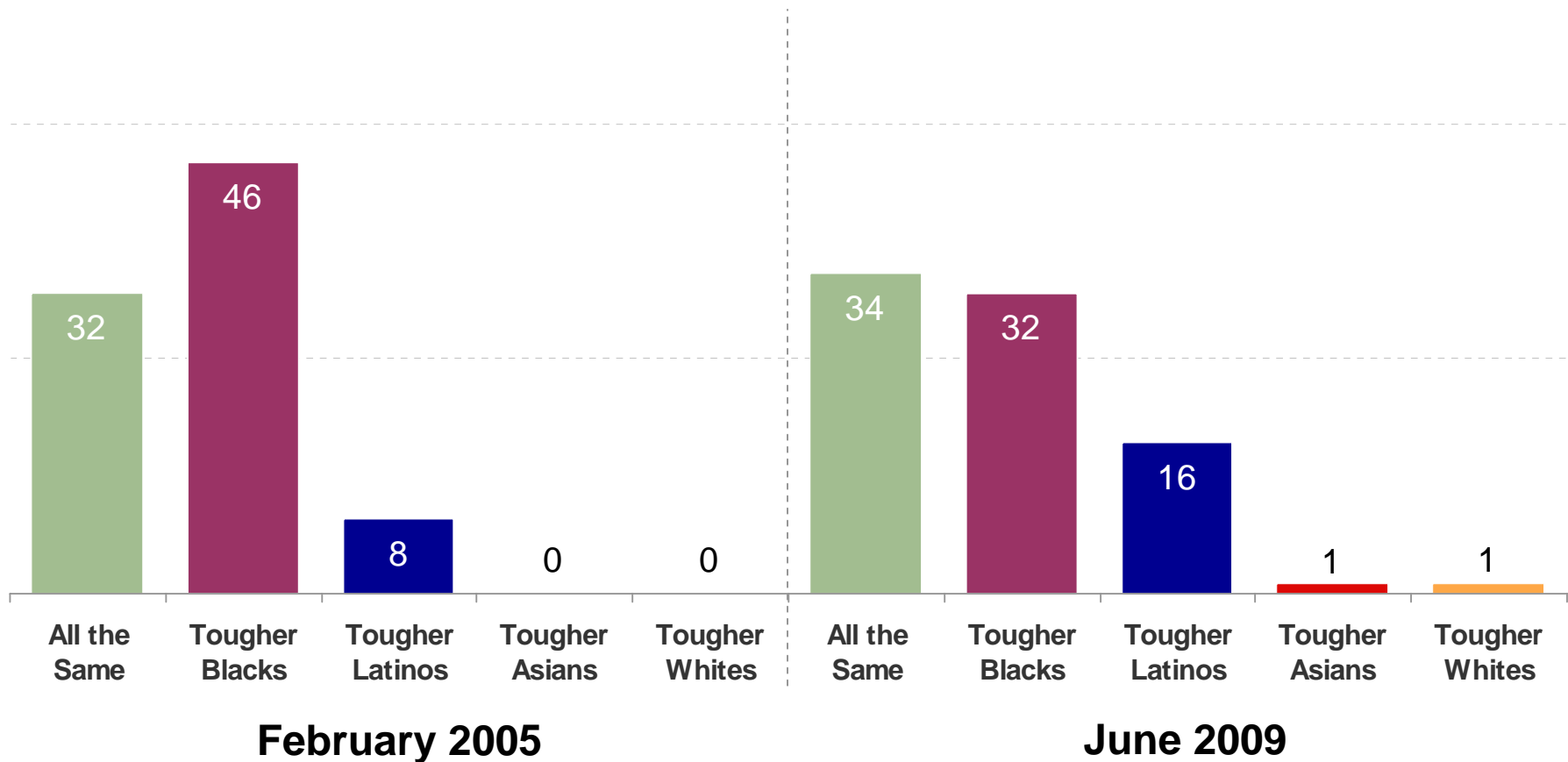

Since 2005, view LAPD tougher on Latinos increased; blacks decreased

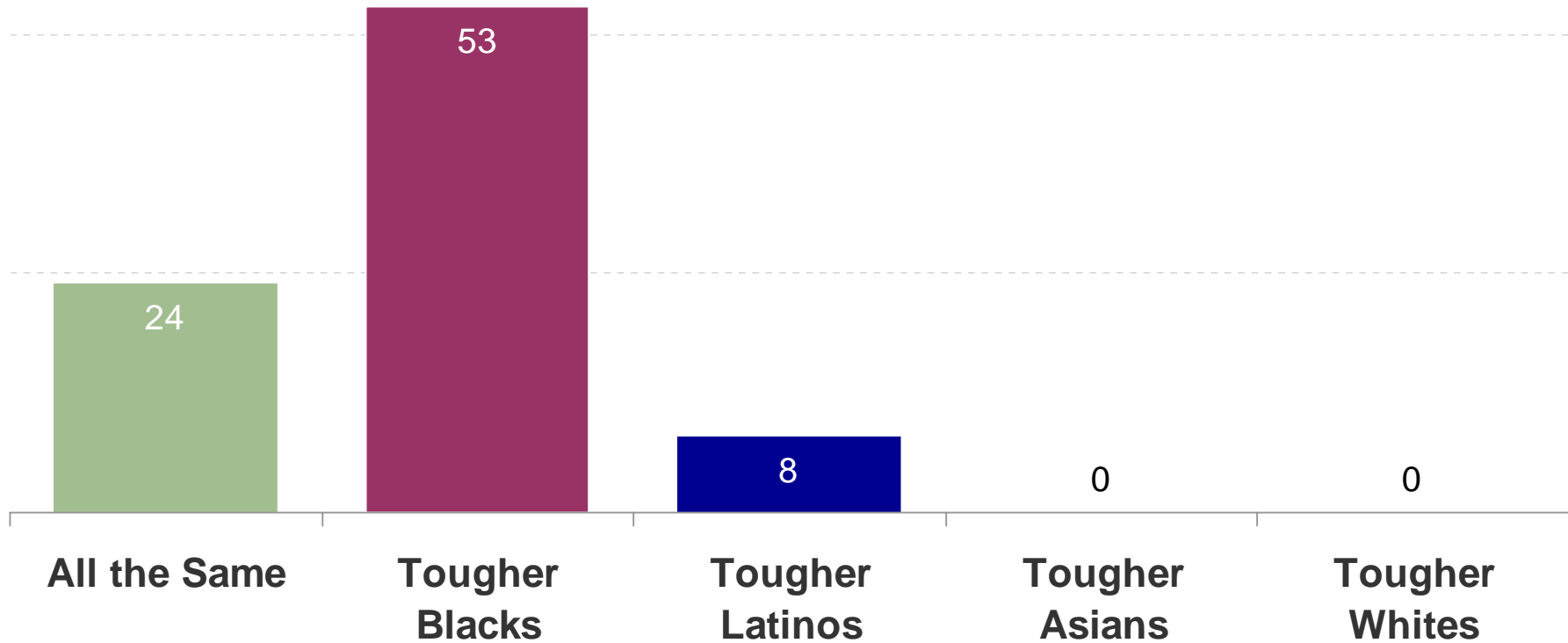

African Americans see themselves treated tougher by police

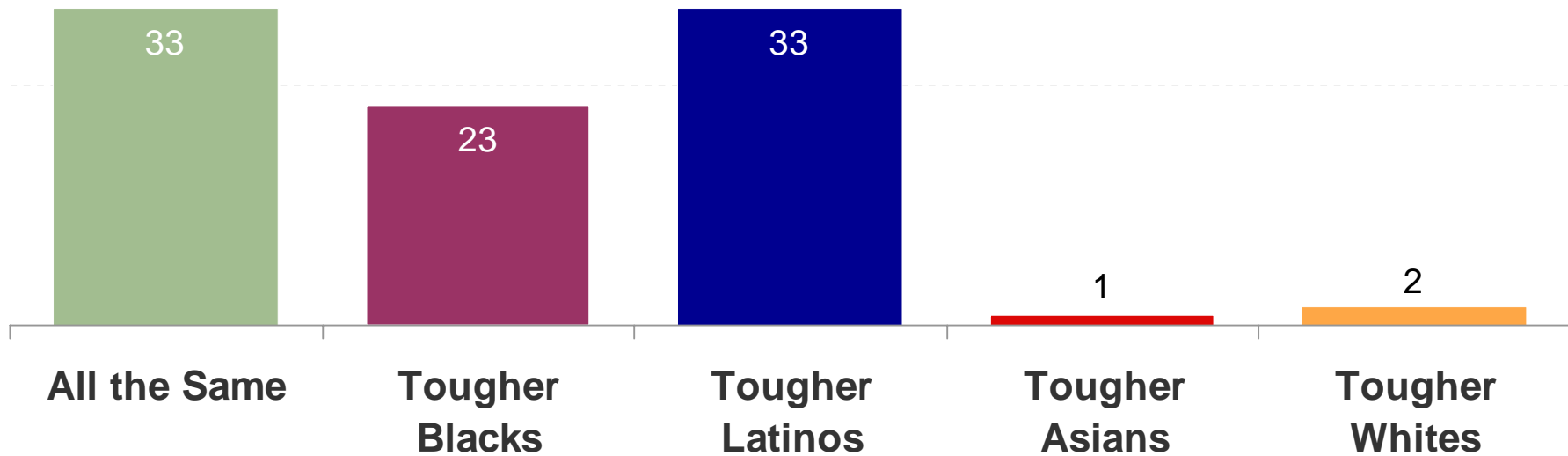
