Q.39 The budget proposed by Jerry Brown closes the 26 billion dollar deficit by cutting around 12 billion dollars in spending and increasing taxes or extending recent tax increases to raise more than 14 billion dollars in revenue. The plan includes major cuts to almost every sector of government including health care, public safety, welfare services and higher education, but not K through 12 education. It cuts salaries for most state employees, and it shifts some responsibilities from the state to local government.
