Methodology

GQR conducted a 15-minute phone survey among likely runoff election voters in Chicago from March 31 – April 4, 2023. The unweighted data is based on 811 respondents and the weighted data is based on 757 respondents. Live phone interviews made up 38 percent of respondents, text-to-web made up the other 62 percent. Respondents were found through voter file sample.


The data is subject to a margin of error of +/- 3.56 percentage points at the 95 percent confidence interval; the margin of error is higher among subgroups and online respondents.

The data are statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional, age, and gender composition reflects that of the estimated likely voters in Chicago.

In this report, results are expressed as percentages unless otherwise noted. Results may not add to 100% due to rounding or multiple responses. Net results cited in the text may not exactly match individual results shown in the charts due to rounding.







Crime




Which TWO aspects of crime are most concerning to you?








Chicagoans favor crime prevention, especially Johnson voters








Crime and the Mayor's Race








Johnson trust driven by support for prevention, distrust by "defund"

Candidate profiles


(JOHNSON/PROGRESSIVE) The issue of public safety is personal to Brandon Johnson/me. The same old policies haven't been working for us and that's why we need a new approach. It's past time we invest in our communities, from mental health crisis responders to year-round youth employment and partnerships between law enforcement and the community to prevent crime before it happens. He/I will also promote 200 detectives from within the Chicago police rank and file to focus on solving violent crime.

(VALLAS/CONSERVATIVE) Crime is out of control and Paul Vallas is/I am the right candidate to make Chicago safe. We have to get serious about charging repeat gun offenders and taking them off the streets before they commit more crimes. Vallas's/My opponent doesn't want you to believe that we can quickly refill the ranks of our police department, even though there are several methods he knows/I know will make it happen. Why not? It's simple – my opponent doesn't want to hire more officers, he wants to defund the police.


