



Principled Veterans Fund Survey 2025 NJ Governor Primary March 2024

Methodology

GQR conducted a 20 minute phone survey among 603 likely 2025 Democratic Primary Election voters in New Jersey from March 7th-12th, 2024. Respondents were contacted through the voter file.


The data is subject to a margin of error of +/- 4.0 percentage points at the 95 percent confidence interval; the margin of error is higher among subgroups.

The data are statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional, age, and gender composition reflects that of the estimated likely 2025 Democratic Primary Election electorate in New Jersey.

In this report, results are expressed as percentages unless otherwise noted. Results may not add to 100% due to rounding or multiple responses. Net results cited in the text may not exactly match individual results shown in the charts due to rounding.






Mood

Abortion is the clear top issue, with education in the second tier. Immigration is not a major concern



Now, I am going to read some pairs of issues. After I read each pair, please tell me which issue is most important to you when thinking about your vote for governor.


(ABORTION) I prefer a governor who prioritizes passing a constitutional amendment to protect abortion rights.





Sherrill leads field in 'very favorable' ratings. Sweeney has highest name ID but views on him are mixed.



Sherrill earns 23 percent of the vote, with Sweeney, Fulop, and Gottheimer trailing significantly



Among abortion motivated voters, Sherrill holds clear lead


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
*Responded 10/10 on the importance of abortion rights for their governor vote and selected abortion as more important than both costs and taxes in a round robin exercise.

Key Takeaways

- Abortion is the central issue animating primary voters. Abortion is the most important issue in this race for governor, higher than other issues like the cost of living and taxes. Among abortion motivated voters, Sherrill holds a clear lead that grows to a near majority (44 percent) after voters hear her biography.
- Sherrill is well positioned to win the 2025 Gubernatorial primary. She also has an advantage as the only woman in the race and among the voters most concerned about protecting abortion rights. She easily beats Gottheimer and Fulop in North Jersey while Sweeney manages only a third of the vote in South Jersey.
- Baraka has a voter base, but he also has a ceiling of support. Throughout the survey, Baraka never gets more than 23 percent of the vote and struggles to expand his base of support.
- Sherrill grows her support after voters hear more about her, especially among women, older voters and voters in both major media markets.





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
